Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees on the Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest:


- Continued to complete accessibility improvement projects at campgrounds and day use sites: purchased and installed accessible picnic tables and fire rings, and replaced pit toilets with accessible ones across the forest.
- Completed security patrols, site clean-up and maintenance tasks, and provided visitor information at 63 fees sites, including campgrounds, interpretive sites, day use areas, and boat launches.
- Partnered with the Oregon Department of Transportation, Medford District of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and Josephine County and plowed snow on Bear Camp Coastal route and provided access to the wild section of the Rogue Wild and Scenic River for both private and commercial rafting trips.
- Completed reissuance of 87 special use permits to Rogue River and Chetco River outfitters and guides.
- Provided portable toilets and dumpsters at popular day use sites along the Chetco River.
- Partnered with other agencies, youth crews, and community members and conducted river clean-up days on the Rogue and Chetco Wild and Scenic Rivers.
- Partnered with the Medford District BLM to administer and monitor the wild section of the Rogue Wild and Scenic River:
 - Managed the commercial and public permit system.
 - Performed law enforcement and river patrols.
 - Completed dispersed campsite clean-up.
 - Provided visitor information and education.

Special Feature

As dusk falls, visitors can enjoy a spectacular view of the sun setting from Bald Knob Lookout. In addition to solitude and magnificent views, a short drive and hike to Hanging Rock in the Wild Rogue Wilderness gives visitors an eagle's perspective of the Rogue Wild and Scenic River corridor. Maintenance of this lookout is funded with recreation fees.

Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest Additional Accomplishments

- Partnered with Coos County Corrections crew, and Curry, Jackson, and Josephine County juvenile crews to complete regular maintenance tasks at fee sites across the forest.
- Completed pre-season safety inspections at campgrounds and annual inspections at sixteen cabin and lookouts.
- Sponsored hazardous tree identification and removal training, and removed hazardous trees in Quosatana Campground and other recreation sites.
- Installed a new porch and accessible ramp at Packers Cabin.
- Issued 14 special use permits for recreation events, including long distance running, triathlon, Cycle Oregon, and mountain biking events. Participants in all events totaled over 4,500.
