A 90-day comment period begins on the date the Notice of Availability for the DEIS was published in the Federal Register. Additional public meetings will be held during the comment period. Public comments will be incorporated into a final EIS (FEIS) and Forest Plan expected to be published in late 2012. Publication of the FEIS will begin a 60-day objection period.

Members of the public, agencies, and groups who commented during the 90-day comment period may file an objection. After the time allowed for resolution of objections, a Record of Decision signed by the Regional Forester will be published and the revised Forest Plan will be in effect.

Members of the public, agencies, and groups who commented during the opportunities for public comment may file an objection. Individual members of organizations must have submitted their own comments to meet the requirements of eligibility as an individual, objections received on behalf of an organization are considered as those of the organization only (36 CFR 219.53).
