



Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees on the Daniel Boone National Forest:

- Completed maintenance and law enforcement patrols at developed recreation sites. This included: mowing, trash removal, and toilet cleaning.
- Removed flood debris at five boat ramps on Cave Run Lake.
- Constructed an accessible parking area and replaced the security light at the Alfrey Boat Ramp toilet.
- Painted accessible parking spaces at Warix and Scott's Creek boat ramps.
- Repaired the information board and updated site information at Longbow Boat Ramp.
- Painted the toilet building interior at Keno Shooting Range.
- Painted the toilet building floor at Appletree Shooting Range.
- Painted the toilet building doors and vent stacks at Natural Arch Scenic Area. Installed fencing to protect resources and discourage user made trails. Maintained the playground surface.

Special Feature

Nestled in the beautiful mountains of eastern Kentucky, Cave Run Lake is known for its incredible muskie fishing and water-based recreation opportunities. Heavy spring rains in 2011 produced record water levels that flooded adjoining recreation sites, including five boat ramps. When the waters receded, recreation fee funds ensured debris was removed and sites cleaned.

- Installed a new information board at the Gladie Cultural-Environmental Learning Center in the Red River Gorge Geological Area.
