The Six Rivers National Forest is filling multiple temporary positions in fire management for the 2014 fire season. Openings are available at the **GS-3**, **GS-4**, and **GS-5** levels. These temporary wildland fire positions have a maximum six month work schedule. The anticipated start date for these positions is early May, 2014. GS-03 EXPERIENCE & EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

The following table shows the amounts of education and/or experience required to qualify for positions covered by this standard.

GRADE	EXPERIENCE		Or EDUCATION
	GENERAL	SPECIALIZED (Firefighting)	
GS-3	6 months	None	Successful completion of 1 year of study that included at least 6 semester hours in a combination of courses such as range management or conservation, agriculture, forestry, wildlife management, engineering, biology, mathematics, or other natural or physical sciences.

General Experience: (1) Any type of work that demonstrates the applicant's ability to perform the work of the position, or (2) experience that provided a familiarity with the subject matter or processes of the broad subject area of the occupation. Equivalent combinations of education and experience are qualifying for all grade levels and positions for which both education and experience are acceptable.

GS-04 EXPERIENCE & EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

The following table shows the amounts of education and/or experience required to qualify for positions covered by this standard.

GRADE	EXPERIENCE		Or EDUCATION
	GENERAL	SPECIALIZED (Firefighting)	
GS-4	6 months	6 months (min)	Successful completion of 2 years of study that included at least 12 semester hours in any combination of courses such as forestry, agriculture, crop or plant science, range management or conservation, wildlife management, watershed management, soil science, natural resources (except marine fisheries and oceanography), outdoor recreation management, civil or forest engineering, or wildland fire science. No more than 3 semester hours in mathematics is creditable.

General Experience: (1) Any type of work that demonstrates the applicant's ability to perform the work of the position, or (2) experience that provided a familiarity with the subject matter or processes of the broad subject area of the occupation.

Specialized Experience (for positions at GS-4): For the Wildland Firefighter, specialized work examples include Forest or range fire control, fire prevention, or suppression work as a member of a handcrew or fire engine.

GS-05 EXPERIENCE & EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

GS-5	None	1 year experience at the GS-4 or equivalent	Successful completion of a full 4-year course of study leading to a bachelor's degree (a) with major study in forestry, range management, agriculture, or a subject-matter field directly related to the position, or (b) that included at least 24 semester hours in any combination of courses such as those shown above for GS-4. No more than 6 semester hours in mathematics is creditable.

Interagency Fire Program Management (IFPM): In addition to the requirements described above applicants must meet the following IFPM Standards to qualify: **Qualifications: FFT1, Training: S-290**

Specialized Experience (for positions at GS-5): For the Wildland Firefighter, specialized work examples include Forest or range fire control, fire prevention, or suppression work as a member of a handcrew or fire engine.
