SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS FOR PAYSON AREA CAMPGROUNDS

PROHIBITIONS

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts and omissions are prohibited on the areas and roads as described in this Order, and as depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A (the “restricted area”), all within the Payson Ranger District, Tonto National Forest, Gila County, Arizona:

1. Public health and safety. 36 CFR 261.53e
2. Being on the road, FDR 405,405A, 893 1625, Ponderosa Campground road, Sharp Creek Campground, Christopher Creek Campground and the State Highway by-pass. 36 CFR 261.54e
3. Being on a trail, Trail 37. 36 CFR 261.55a

EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of any organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Residence owners and lessees of land, and holders of Forest Service special use authorizations within the restricted area may use Forest Systems Road as ingress and regress from their property.

AREA DESCRIBED

The restricted area includes all National Forest System lands, roads trails within the exterior boundaries as described as follows:

All lands encompassed by the Ponderosa Campground, Sharp Creek Campground, and Christopher Creek Campground. Including the described roads and trails. From the junction of State Highway 260 and Forest Designated Road (FDR) 405A, south, southwest along FDR 405A, FDR 893(approximately 0.5 miles) to Forest System Trail 37. South on Trail 37 to the Hell’s Gate Wilderness boundary. East, northeast along the Hell’s Gate Wilderness boundary to FDR 405. North along FDR 405 to State Highway 260. State Highway 260 south back to FDR 405A including the construction by-pass.

SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS FOR PAYSON AREA CAMPGROUNDS

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Order is the protection of National Forest visitors and employees from possible Bear encounters. This effort is a joint venture with Arizona Game and Fish.

IMPLEMENTATION

1. Prohibitions contained in this Order become effective immediately upon execution of the Order and will remain in effect until July 15, 2012, unless terminated sooner.
2. These restrictions are in addition to the general prohibitions found at 36 CFR 261, Subpart A.
3. Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for organizations, imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. [16 USC 551, 18 USC 3559, 3571 and 3581].
