Fire Use Restriction

Due to rising temperatures, the seasonal drying of fuel moistures and predicted fire weather forecasts the forest now needs to mitigate fire use for public safety. In order to protect the natural resources and public safety, the Forest Supervisor is imposing fire restrictions throughout the forest on July 3, 2012 through the end of the official 2012 fire season.

By restricting open fires: campfires of wood and charcoal to the below listed, developed recreation sites, and the designated campfire use sites, it is less likely that an escaped campfire will accidentally cause a wildland fire. Therefore, I will restrict fire use to those developed recreation sites and the designated campfire use sites listed on Exhibit A.

In addition, I will restrict smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, or a developed recreation site listed and the designated campfire use sites on Exhibit A, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material.

I will also restrict operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order.

These restrictions are effective as of July 3, 2012 and will remain in effect until fire danger conditions no longer exist.

Implementation of this Forest Order is in compliance with current NEPA policy and direction as stated in the Forest Service Handbook, Categorical Exclusion From Documentation, Section 31.12 (Closing an area during a period of extreme fire danger). This action is administrative in nature and does not implement any ground disturbing action. Therefore, this action does not pose any significant impacts on forest resources. Based on current conditions regarding potential fire danger the Forest Supervisor has determined that implementation of this Forest Order is necessary. This is not a project or activity implementing a land and resource management plan that is documented in a decision memo, decision notice, or record of decision.

ORDER NO. 12-04
FIRE USE RESTRICTIONS
LOS PADRES NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety and protect natural resources, the following acts are prohibited within the Los Padres National Forest. This Order is effective from July 3, 2012, through the end of the official 2012 fire season.

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, except in the Developed Recreation Sites and the Designated Campfire Use Sites listed in Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.52(a).
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a Developed Recreation Site or the Designated Campfire Use Sites listed in Exhibit A, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material. 36 CFR 261.52(d).
3. Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order. 36 CFR 261.52(j).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. Persons with a valid California Campfire Permit are not exempt from the prohibitions listed above. However, persons with a valid California Campfire permit may use portable lanterns or stoves using gas, jellied petroleum, or pressurized liquid fuel.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.


