Order 12-11

FOREST ORDER

Fire, Occupancy, and Use Restrictions

Pursuant to Title 16 United States Code Section 551 and Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations Section 261.50(a), the following acts are prohibited within the **Cimarron Recreation Area**, described as those National Forest System lands within the recreation area boundary signs, located in the North ½ of Section 31, Township 33 South, Range 41 West, and the Northeast ¼ of Section 36, Township 33 South, Range 42 West, 6th PM, Morton County, Kansas, as shown on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire or campfire or stove fire. 36 CFR 261.52(a)
(This prohibition includes, but is not limited to charcoal grills, hibachis, and coal or wood burning stoves.)

EXCEPTIONS: Campfires are permitted in the Forest Service developed campground and group campground, and only in Forest Service-provided, manufactured fire grates and grills. Petroleum fueled or other self-contained chemical stoves, lanterns, or heating devices are allowed on all National Forest System lands, provided such devices meet the fire underwriter's specifications for safety.

2. Parking or leaving a vehicle outside a parking space assigned to one's own camp unit. 36CFR 261.58(h)
3. Possessing, parking, or leaving more than two (2) vehicles, except motorcycles or bicycles, per camp unit. 36 CFR 261.58(i)
4. Using a campsite or other area described by the order by more than the number of users allowed by the order. 36 CFR 261.58(f)
 - a. The maximum number of people allowed to use a Forest Service developed campsite is ten (10) unless otherwise posted.
5. Being publicly nude. 36 CFR 261.58(j)
6. Entering or being in any body of water. 36 CFR 261.58(k)

EXEMPTIONS:


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any federal, state, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force, in the performance of an official duty.

This order supersedes Order 12-07 dated 7/28/2012, applicable to the Cimarron Recreation Area, Cimarron National Grassland.

This Order shall be in effect from the date of signature through June 30, 2017, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for a legal entity other than an individual, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. (16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559 and 3571)
