Maroon Creek	Open. Shuttle service has begun for the season, which means vehicle traffic is restricted from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. while the shuttle is in service. For shuttle tickets & updates call RFTA at 970-925-8484.

Avalanche Creek Road	Open.
Basalt Mountain, FS 509 & 524	Open to the upper gate at Mill Creek.
Burnt Mountain, FS 506	Open.
Crystal City, FS 314	Clear for 4x4's & ATV's.
Capitol Creek	Open.
Cattle Creek, FS 509	Open.
Cottonwood Pass	Open and dry.
Cunningham Creek	Seasonal conditions.
Eagle-Thomasville, FS 400	Open. Mostly dry with a few muddy patches and puddles.
Express Creek	Reports of snow fields blocking access to Taylor Pass.
Four Mile, FS 300	Open. Report of a large tree down across road near Twin Peaks blocking access.
Hagerman Pass, FS 105	Road has been plowed and passable by 4x4 with a few snow patches near the pass.
Hubbard, FS 408	Open, be prepared for slick conditions when road is wet.
Kobey Park, FS 103 & 508	Open.
Lead King Basin Loop Crystal, 314+ Lead King, 315	Open to Geneva Lake trailhead. Expect seasonal conditions on the full loop. The Crystal road is open.
Lincoln Creek, FS 106	Open to Portal Campground and closed beyond to allow road conditions to stabilize.
Little Annie Road	Seasonal conditions.
Midnight Mine	Seasonal conditions.
Montezuma Road, 102	Snow at upper elevations; be prepared for stream crossing.
North Fork Road	Clear and dry.
Pearl Pass	Snow at upper elevations; be prepared for stream crossing.
Prince Creek Road	Clear to Dinkle Lake.
Red Table, FS 514	Open for 6 ½ miles.
Red Rim/Gerbaz Road, FS 534	Open.
Richmond Ridge, FS 123	Seasonal conditions.
Smuggler Mine	Seasonal conditions.
Summer Road	For road opening times & updates call Aspen Ski Co at 970-925-1220.
Taylor Pass	Seasonal conditions.
Thompson Ck, FS 304/305/306	Open, be prepared for slick conditions when road is wet.

Aspen-Sopris Trail Conditions

July 6, 2012

Conditions are presently not available for all trails. Expect seasonal conditions on all trails.

TRAIL	CONDITION*
American Lake	Dry to lake, with many down trees along trail.
Anthracite Pass/Raspberry Loop	Cleared of down trees for the first mile, with dry conditions beyond.
Arbaney-Kittle	Clear and dry to overlook and beyond towards Kobey park.
Avalanche Lake	Dry and cleared of down trees to the Hell Roaring junction.
Braderich Trail	Clear.
Buckskin Pass	Trail is dry and the pass is passable.
Capitol Creek	Dry.
Capitol Creek Ditch Tr.	Dry.
Carbonate Creek	Dry.
Cathedral Lake	Dry to electric pass.
Conundrum Creek	All Passes are dry. Bear proof food storage and water treatment are important. No dogs allowed past the second crossing of Conundrum Creek (Silver Dollar Pond). Pack out all trash and human waste. Be prepared for stream crossing. No Fires!
Crater Lake	Dry.
Difficult Creek	Dry.
Discovery/Braille	Dry.
Eagle Lake	Dry with down trees across the trail to the lake.
East Creek	Dry and cleared of trees for the first two miles.
East Maroon Creek	Dry.
East Snowmass Creek	Clear and dry to Willow lake.
Four Pass Loop	Dry. No Fires! The creek crossings are knee deep or less. Willow thickets and trees remain on the trail in places. Please pack out all trash, including toilet paper.
Fravert Basin	Dry.
Frying Pan Lakes	Avalanche debris along the trails with several large trees across the trail. Expect patches of snow to lakes.
Geneva Lake	Seasonal conditions.
Gift Creek	Seasonal conditions. Route finding skills are necessary.
Government Trail	Open for the season.
Granite	Seasonal conditions.
Grizzly Lake	Muddy conditions in the trees at higher elevation.
Hanging Lake	Clear.
Hannon Creek	Seasonal conditions.
Hay Park	Muddy conditions in the trees at higher elevation.
Hell Roaring	Clear and dry of down trees.
Hunter Creek	Dry.
Hunter Valley	Dry.
Linkins Lake	Mostly dry with a small snowfield near the saddle.
Lost Man	Lower Entrance: Dry. Upper Entrance: Mostly dry with some snow near the pass. Please protect the alpine environment & stay on the trail.
Lyle/Mormon Lakes	Seasonal conditions.
Maroon Creek Trail	Clear to Crater lake and beyond.
Maroon Lake Scenic	Clear and dry.
Middle Thompson	Seasonal conditions.
Midway Pass	Dry to Midway Pass.
New York Creek	Dry.
Perham Creek	Clear and dry.
Petroleum/Anderson	Clear and dry.
Placita	Seasonal conditions.
Rio Grande	Clear.
Ruedi Overlook	Clear and dry.
Savage Lakes	Dry with many down trees along the trail.
Sawyer Lake	Down trees along trail to the lake.
Snowmass Lake	Dry. Trees are down on the trail to the lake. NO FIRES! Pack out all trash. Bury or pack out human waste. Be prepared for stream crossing.
South Fork Pass	Clear and dry.
Sunnyside/Shadyside	Hunter Valley Entrance: Clear to 4 corners. Cemetery Lane Entrance: Clear on both Shady Side & Sunny Side.



Tabor Creek	Dry.
Thomas Lakes	Clear and dry to the lakes.
Weller Lake	Dry to the lake with several down trees across the trail.
West Maroon	Dry trail conditions; Be prepared for stream crossing. Major avalanche below Emerald Lake adds 2 miles onto hike to Crested Butte.
West Snowmass	Creek crossing is knee deep and 30' wide.
Williams Lake	Dry.
Willow Lake	Seasonal conditions.
Woody Creek	Seasonal conditions.
Yule	Expect melting snow conditions in the upper elevations.

Seasonal Advisory

- **A fire ban is in effect for the White River National Forest & BLM land in Pitkin (920-5200), Eagle (328-3545), & Garfield counties (963-2491 & 384-6480).**

Wildlife Advisory

- **A food storage order is in effect for *all* campgrounds & dispersed campsites up Independence Pass & Castle Creek. All food must be secured & stored in a proper bear storage locker.**
- **If there is no bear storage locker, then all bear attractants & human food, garbage, & pet foods should be stored in locked vehicles, bear-proof food containers, or hung 10ft above ground and 4ft away from other objects.**
- **Potential bear activity at Conundrum.**

Known bear activity:

- **A mother bear and her cub were reported hanging out in Avalanche Campground on June 21.**
- **Bear broke into vehicle at Lincoln Creek June 8.**
- **Multiple bear sightings in Maroon Valley and one encounter at a campground the week of July 4th.**
- **Nuisance bear activity at Difficult and Weller Campgrounds May 28 to June 6.**
- **Bears are opportunistic feeders, they go after the easy food especially if they have gotten used to human foods.** To minimize the potential of attracting a bear to your campsite, campers must observe following precautions: **1)** when not in use, store your food and cooking equipment in an enclosed vehicle; **2)** do not take any food into your tent at any time; **3)** leave the clothing worn during food preparation in your vehicle and not in your tent; and **4)** do not set your tent up in close proximity to your cooking area. **These guidelines apply in any camping situation, but are especially applicable in dispersed camping areas.**
- **Mountain Lion attacked a dog off leash at Tellurium Lake trail in the Holy Cross Wilderness the last week of June.**
