FOREST ORDER

Occupancy and Use Restrictions

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50 (a) and (b) and to protect natural resources and public safety due to an active forest fire, the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands within the Waldo Canyon Fire Area on the Pike National Forest, in El Paso County, Colorado (hereinafter the "Restricted Area"), and on all roads and trails located within the Restricted Area, (hereinafter the "Restricted Roads and Trails"). The Restricted Area and the Restricted Roads and Trails are depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this order as Exhibit A.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Going into or being upon the Restricted Area. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e), 36 C.F.R. § 261.52(e)
2. Being on the Restricted Roads. 36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e),
3. Being on the Restricted Trails. 36 C.F.R. § 261.55 (a),

EXEMPTIONS:


Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Any federal, state or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force, in the performance of an official duty;
2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

This order supersedes, rescinds and replaces order 12-10, issued July 5, 2012.

This order shall be in effect on July 19th, 2012, at 12:01 PM and remain in effect through October 1, 2012, or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for a legal entity other than an individual, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559 and 3571).
