

Multiple-Use Trail Information

Rules and Regulations - Fines range from \$125 - \$500

- OHVs are allowed only on the designated Multiple-Use Trail System, cross-country travel is not permitted.
- **Only street legal vehicles are allowed on Forest Service roads.**
- OHVs used on the Multiple-Use Trail System must be no wider than 50 inches.
- OHVs must be equipped with an exhaust which has a spark arrestor which emits 96 decibels of sound or less.
- OHVs must have a current Texas OHV decal properly mounted on the vehicle.
- OHV operators must carry a valid ID, proof of day-use payment, and if riding an ATV, proof of ATV Operator Education Course completion.
- Riders must wear approved helmet and eye protection.
- Passengers are not allowed on an OHV unless it is specifically designed by the manufacturer for multiple riders.
- OHVs operated after sunset and before sunrise must be equipped with working head and tail lights.

Texas Off-Highway Vehicle Decal

- To ride on public land in Texas, any vehicle used for trail riding (street legal or not) must have a current Texas Off-Highway Vehicle Decal properly mounted on the vehicle.
- A Texas OHV decal can be purchased from the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department Customer Service Center (CSC). The CSC phone number is: 512-389-8917. Decal cost is \$8 and may be paid for with a credit card. Decals are valid from September 1 to August 31 of each year.
