

**Order Number 2012-07**  
**Special Road Restrictions and Intermittent Road Closure Order**  
**For National Forest System Roads (NFSR) 704**  
**During Construction Activities Associated with Culvert Replacements**  
**Holy Cross Ranger District**  
**White River National Forest**  
**Eagle County, Colorado**

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 C.F.R. § 261.50 the following act is prohibited on the described National Forest System Road (NFSR) located within the Holy Cross Ranger District, White River National Forest, Eagle County, Colorado (hereinafter the "Restricted Road"). The Restricted Road is further defined as follows: National Forest System Road NFSR 704 (Missouri Creek Road) – All travel will be prohibited from the intersection of NFSR 727 (Fancy/French Road) including the Missouri Lakes Trailhead parking lot to its terminus; approximately 1.5 mile. The Restricted Road is also depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A. The road will be closed during the culvert replacement and then reopened when construction is complete and safe for public travel.

The purpose of this Order is to protect public health and safety during replacement of a culvert.

**PROHIBITION:**

1. Being on the Restricted Roads when road closure devices and signs are in place. (36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e))


**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

This Order shall be in effect beginning August 27, 2012 and continue until rescinded or until September 9, 2012, whichever event occurs first.

Violations of these prohibitions are punishable as a Class B Misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3559, and 3571)
