

## Appendix 4: Applicable Forest Orders

The Permit Holder will need to become familiar with the specifics of the Code of Federal Regulations and Regional and Forest Orders listed below. Additional Forest Orders may be implemented at any time and the Permit Holder will be responsible for compliance.

36 CFR 261.3	Interfering with a Forest Officer
36 CFR 261.4	Disorderly Conduct
36 CFR 261.6	Timber and Other Forest Products
36 CFR 261.9	Property

36 CFR 261.13	Use of Vehicles off roads
36 CFR 261.14	Developed Recreation Sites
36 CFR 261.15	Admission, recreation use and special recreation permit fees
36 CFR 261.58	Occupancy and Use

Please note that many of the Kaibab National Forest Orders are currently undergoing revision. There are several Forest Orders that are expected to be implemented in the next year (2013). Forest Orders that are expected to be in place for the term of the permit are:

- 36 CFR 261.58(a) Prohibiting camping for a period longer than allowed by the order (expected to be 14-days).
- 36 CFR 261.58(e) Prohibiting camping (expected to be within 1 (or 1/2) mile of a developed campground).
- 36 CFR 261.58(k) Prohibiting entering or being in a body of water (expected to be swimming or wading in any of the campground lakes).

In addition to the orders expected to be enacted above, there are several seasonal Forest Orders that may be enacted seasonally, they include:

- 36 CFR 261.52(a) Prohibiting building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire.
- 36 CFR 261.52(c) Prohibiting smoking
- 36 CFR 261.52(h) Prohibiting operating an internal combustion engine

Additional Forest Orders may be implemented at any time and the Permit Holder will be responsible for compliance.
