SPECIAL ORDER
TEMPORARY EMERGENCY CLOSURE ORDER**

**Stage I Fire Restrictions
For the Judith, Belt Creek, White Sulphur Springs, and Musselshell Ranger Districts of the
Lewis and Clark National Forest
Region One**

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulation 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited within the lands managed by the Judith, Belt Creek, White Sulphur Springs, and Musselshell Ranger Districts of the Lewis and Clark National Forest on the Lewis and Clark National Forest. These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations and become effective at 12:01am (00:01), Mountain Daylight Time on Saturday September 8, 2012 and will remain in effect until rescinded or revoked.

36 CFR 261.52 – Fire:

1. Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire. [36 CFR 261.52(a)]

Note: For the purpose of this order under Stage I fire restrictions campfires and charcoal fires are allowed **ONLY** at the designated recreation sites or campgrounds named below and made a part of this order, within established metal fire rings provided at the sites.

Belt Creek Ranger District:

- Aspen Campground
- Kings Hill Campground
- Kings Hill Cabin
- Many Pines Campground
- Logging Creek Campground

Judith Ranger District:

- Judith Landing Campground/picnic site
- Dry Wolf Campground
- Crystal Lake Campground Complex
- Hay Canyon Campground
- Indian Hill Campground
- Thain Creek Campground

Musselshell Ranger District:

- Spring Creek Campground

White Sulphur Springs Ranger District:

- Jumping Creek Campground
- Moose Creek Campground
- Grasshopper Campground
- Richardson Campground

Wood stove fires (with approved spark arrestor screens) or fires fueled solely by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels may be used anywhere on National Forest System lands during Stage I fire restrictions.

2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material. [36 CFR 261.52(d)]

Note: For the purpose of this order under Stage I fire restrictions; the above exception for smoking also includes improved places of habitation, developed designated recreation sites or campgrounds.

Exemptions:

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following are exempt from this restriction:

1. Persons with a permit issued by a forest officer specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Penalty:

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559 and 3571).
