Subject: Olympic Peninsula RAC 2013 Project Recommendations

To: Regional Forester

On September 12, 2012, the Olympic Peninsula Resource Advisory Committee (RAC) met in Olympia, Washington, to review FY2013 Title II project proposals and make recommendations for the expenditure of funds resulting from the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act. This letter serves to document the RAC's project recommendations and my approval of the following project work.

Actual funding amounts may vary by county; please see the notes below on how each county has planned for changes in the expected funding amounts. All of the projects occur on, or to the benefit of, National Forest lands in Clallam, Grays Harbor, Jefferson, and Mason Counties.


