**Recreation Program Fee Accomplishment Report 2011**

*Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use and value.*

**Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees on the Six Rivers National Forest:**

- Completed maintenance and operation tasks at recreation fee sites: removed hazard trees and cleared brush, cleaned and pumped toilets, collected trash and recyclables, checked compliance, cleared and maintained campground trails, and removed graffiti.
- Placed rock barriers and bear-proof trash and recycle containers in Peach Creek Day Use Area.
- Installed two bear-proof recycle bins at Big Flat Campground and new recycle bins in Peach Creek, Oak Bottom, Aikens and Dillion campgrounds.
- Provided drinking water at Nordheimer Campground.
- Purchased new site identification sign for Fish Lake Campground and new storage shed for the host site.
- Placed 12 cement picnic tables in Nordheimer Campground.
- Repaired a bathroom door at Haypress Trailhead.
- Installed new equestrian water troughs at Ten Bear and Haypress trailheads.
- Finalized the Fish Lake Day Use Area site plan.

**Special Feature**

Near the town of Willow Creek and the Trinity River, Boise Creek Campground is an ideal place to enjoy the area's outdoor recreation opportunities. Fishing, swimming and white-water rafting opportunities are just waiting for adventurers. In 2011, recreation fees helped replace old, wooden vehicle barriers with rock ones. This will help protect the campground's vegetation including its large Pacific madrone, Douglas fir and California bay trees.

## Six Rivers National Forest Additional Accomplishments

- Supported forest-wide volunteer program, including on-site hosts who assisted with recreation fee site operations and maintenance.
- Partnered with AmeriCorps Watershed Stewards and other volunteer groups and maintained the Horse Linto Interpretive Trail. Horse Linto served as staging area for Humboldt State University Cycling Club mountain bike race.
- Supported Backcountry Horsemen who repaired corrals, water lines and campsites at Steinacher and Ten Bear trailheads.
- Partnered with the Hoopa Tribal Forestry and Weaverville Civilian Conservation Corps and completed trail maintenance on Horse Ridge and Long Prairie trails.
- Maintained Myrtle Creek Interpretive Trail with the help of Boy Scout Troop 10.
- Administered and monitored outfitter and guide and recreation special use permits.
