

Burn Permits

Violations of any burning permit terms are a violation of state law (Public Resources Code 4421, 4422, 4423, and 4425).

- **Burn barrels are not allowed.**
- Dry, natural vegetation, grown on the property, can still be burned outdoors in open piles, unless prohibited by local controls.
- No household trash or garbage can be burned.

Burn permits, **which are required**, are issued by your local, state, and federal fire agencies. Burn permits are only valid on "Permissive Burn Days" as determined by the State Air Resources Board or the local Air Pollution Control District.

CHECK WITH YOUR LOCAL AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO FIND OUT IF BURNING IS ALLOWED
IN YOUR AREA AND FOR BURN DAY INFORMATION!

DEBRIS BURNING...

The following are permit terms for burning debris in small piles:

- Maximum pile size is not to exceed 4 feet by 4 feet.
- Area within 10 feet of the outer edge of pile is maintained free and clear of all flammable material and vegetation
- Responsible adult must be in attendance with shovel until fire is dead out.
- Water supply at burning site.
- No burning shall be undertaken unless weather conditions (particularly wind) are such that burning can be considered safe.
