ORDER No. RSF-193

**Temporary area closure to provide for public health and safety during helicopter logging operations**

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR Part 261.50(a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited within the boundaries of the Siskiyou Mountains Ranger District on the Rogue River-Siskiyou National Forest, as described in this order and identified on the attached map, Exhibit A, from October 29, 2012 until December 15, 2012, or unless sooner rescinded:

- 1) Going into or being upon the area described below between sunrise and sunset, Monday through Friday, excluding Federal holidays. **36CFR 261.53(e)**

AREA CLOSURE DESCRIPTION:

The Ashland Forest Resiliency closure area includes all National Forest Lands within T.39S., R.1E., Sections 17, 19, 20, and 30, Willamette Meridian, as identified in the attached map, Exhibit A. This includes the area north of Horn Gap and south of the National Forest boundary. Portions of Forest Service Roads 2060 and 2060.200 and Trail 1014 (Horn Gap Trail) and all of Roads 2060.300 and 2060.400 are included in this order.

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR Part 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from the Order:

- 1) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
- 2) Any Federal, State or local Law Enforcement Officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire-fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in Title 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.
