
HOW TO TREAD LIGHTLY

- Obtain a Travel Map from the Forest Service, or regulations from other public land agencies. Learn the rules and follow them.
- Avoid running over young trees, shrubs, and grasses—damaging or killing them.
- Stay off soft, wet roads and trails readily torn up by vehicles (particularly during hunting seasons). Repairing the damage is expensive.
- Travel around meadows, steep hillsides, or streambanks and lakeshores easily scarred by churning wheels.
- Resist the urge to pioneer a new road or trail, or to cut across a switchback.
- Stay away from wild animals that are rearing young—or suffering from food shortage. Stress can sap scarce energy reserves.
- Obey gate closures and regulatory signs. Vandalsism costs tax dollars.
- Stay out of Wildernesses. They're closed to all vehicles. Know where the boundaries are.
- Get permission to travel across private land. Respect landowner rights.

Future opportunities for exciting travel with your recreation vehicle are in your hands—TREAD LIGHTLY!

SIGNS

The boundary of the Travel Restricted Area is marked on all major entry points by a "Entering Motor Travel Restricted Area" sign and a "Leaving Motor Travel Restricted Area" sign as shown below:

- PURPOSE OF RESTRICTIONS:
- A - Maintain or improve the soil resource and/or prevent excessive soil erosion.
 - B - Provide for a semi-primitive non-motorized recreation opportunity.
 - C - Maintain or improve feed and/or cover for big game animals.
 - D - Provide big game animals with areas free of excessive disturbance during key periods, such as wintering and fawning.
 - E - Congressionally designated wilderness.
 - F - Maintain or improve desirable vegetative condition.
 - G - Protect structural watershed improvements.
 - H - Allow study areas to change naturally without excessive impacts of man.
 - I - Preserve unique Forest elements such as, cultural, geologic, scenic, and/or ecologic features.

ORDER FOR AREAS, ROADS, AND TRAILS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 26150 (a) and (b), the prohibitions, restrictions, or uses of vehicles in areas or on roads or trails or segments thereof are as shown on the Manti-LaSal National Forest Travel Map. Prohibitions or restrictions as noted on the travel map apply to National Forest lands and Forest development roads for the periods specified until further notice.

Under authority of 36 CFR 26150 (a) and (b), it is prohibited to:


- Use any type of vehicle on a road when prohibited or restricted as shown on the Travel Map. (36 CFR 26154)
- Use any type of vehicle on a trail when prohibited or restricted as shown on the Travel Map. (36 CFR 26155)
- Use or possess a vehicle off forest development roads when prohibited or restricted as shown on the Travel Map. (36 CFR 26156)
- Use or possess a vehicle in a National Forest Wilderness Area. (36 CFR 26157)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 26150(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- Persons with a permit or contract authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
- Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Violations of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment of not more than 6 months or both (16 USC 551).
