




## MANAGEMENT AREA DIRECTION

Management area direction provides the emphasis to attain particular objectives. This direction is applied to each management area based on the management emphasis. This map shows the specific locations where management area direction will be implemented.

- BDC** Emphasis is on providing Developed Recreation Sites. This includes sites for campgrounds, picnic grounds, trailheads, visitor information facilities, and water related support facilities. Other resource uses can occur, but are generally subordinate to the recreation use.
- UDR** Emphasis is on providing Undeveloped Motorized Recreation Sites. This includes sites along arterial, collector, local and some non-system roads, and near water bodies where concentrated dispersed recreation occurs. Other resource uses occur, but dispersed recreation opportunity class is preserved.
- SPH** Emphasis is on providing Semi-Primitive Recreation Use. Recreation opportunities such as hiking, horseback riding, hunting, cross country skiing, day use, and ORV use are available. Some areas are closed to motorized vehicles. Other resource uses occur so long as the area is rehabilitated to reflect as closely as possible, previous undisturbed conditions.
- KWR** Emphasis is on Key Big Game Winter Range. These areas must be available to big game and unencumbered each year during the critical winter period. Vegetative treatments emphasize habitat improvement or maintenance. Other uses may occur subject to these conditions.
- GWR** Emphasis is on General Big Game Winter Range. These are areas that wildlife traditionally use in winter. Other uses may occur so long as it does not conflict with or cause unacceptable stress on wildlife, and so long as the activity or its rehabilitation emphasizes habitat maintenance or enhancement.
- WFC** Timber types are managed to produce wood fiber and, where appropriate, forage. Other uses occur, and the use or its rehabilitation emphasize rangeland maintenance or enhancement.
- TOR** Emphasis is on Wood-Fiber Production and Harvest. This includes areas with timber stands capable of producing high value wood products. Inclusions of other vegetative types occur that may be managed for other uses. Other uses occur so long as the use or its rehabilitation return the area to a condition that is in harmony with the timber emphasis.
- RPA** Not Mapped - Emphasis is on Riparian Area Management. This area may occur in any other mapped area. However, it is identified by its proximity to water, and it is managed to enhance the riparian ecosystem. Any uses may occur so long as it maintains or enhances the riparian ecosystem.
- MWS** Emphasis is on Municipal Water Supply. These areas include portions of watersheds and spring or water sources dedicated to the production of municipal water. The area is managed to maintain the integrity of the water system, and limited other use may occur so long as it does not violate the integrity of the system.
- WPE** Emphasis is on Watershed Protection/Improvement. This includes areas where watershed treatments have occurred and other resource use is limited to protect the watershed investments. Other uses can occur so long as the use or its rehabilitation does not degrade the watershed treatment.
- MDA** Emphasis is on Leasable Mineral Development. This includes areas where the land surface is or will be used for facilities needed for an extended period in the extraction of leasable minerals. Other resource uses may occur. Long-term investments in other resources or their use will not be made until extraction is complete and the area is rehabilitated to other uses.
- OPI** May or May Not be Mapped - Emphasis is on management of Research Protection and Interpretive Areas. This includes ecological, geological, paleontological, archeological, historical, or other special sites or features. Special Interest Areas, Research Natural Areas, and the Great Basin Forest and Range Experiment Station are included. Other uses are limited by the need to maintain the values for which the areas are established.
- DOW** Emphasis is on Wilderness Opportunities. This includes the Dark Canyon Wilderness. Other uses can occur so long as they do not violate the intent of wilderness or wilderness values.
- SLD** Emphasis is on Special Land Designations. This includes existing and potential lands set aside for special land uses or administrative sites. Other uses are generally prohibited owing to the specialized use placed upon the land.
- UCW** Emphasis is on Utility Corridors and Windows. This includes existing and potential lands used or suitable for use for major pipelines or electrical transmission lines. Activities in these areas strive to be compatible with adjacent management areas. Other compatible uses may occur.
