Item #1: Addendum

The Prospectus submittal deadline has been **extended** to Monday, December 10, 2012, at 4:30 PM, close of business, Mountain Standard Time. The deadline extension is to accommodate a 45-day advertising period.

Item #2: Addendum, and/or Corrigendum/Erratum, and/or Supplement

The shower building that is currently located at Pinegrove Campground is property of the current permit holder. The Forest Service would like to maintain or improve services that are already in place. The prospective applicant/bidder should describe how they will maintain or improve current services at all locations, in this case, shower services at Pinegrove Campground. The current shower building has four (4) standard shower stalls and one (1) ADA compliant shower stall. The shower building is portable and has wheels for transportation purposes.

Item #3: Addendum, and/or Corrigendum/Erratum, and/or Supplement

All Forest Service-owned potable water storage tanks that utilize a hauled water "system", above and below ground, are 5,000 gallon storage tanks. The permit holder is required to utilize, clean, and maintain the Forest Service-owned potable water storage tanks at locations that provide water to the public. The permit holder shall also submit for and pass a monthly bacteriological test; these monthly test results shall be submitted to the Forest Service.

Item #4: Addendum and/or Supplement

The permit holder must utilize National Sanitation Foundation or food grade approved tanks and liners when using permit holder-owned portable, potable water tanks. All permit holder-owned, portable and non-portable, potable water tanks must submit for and pass a monthly bacteriological test; these monthly test results shall be submitted to the Forest Service. This includes tanks that are not for public use, such as water holding tanks at host sites.

Item #5: Addendum

The permit holder shall provide a water sampling plan to the Forest Service at the beginning of each operating season. This can be included in the Annual Operating Plan.

Item #6: Addendum

The permit holder shall provide a minimum of one (1) certified waste water operator with a Grade 1 Certification in both Waste Water Collection and Treatment.
