This amendment is designed to address the 2nd Level Review of Appeal #12-03-07-0004-A251 and the Regional Office's decision to cancel 10% of your permitted numbers for the Smoot Lake and Moritz Lake Grazing Allotments. This decision was sent to you in a letter from the Regional Office dated July 24, 2012.

Per the Regional Office's direction, the grazing permittee and the Forest Service cooperatively delineated the following priority work needed to bring current dilapidated fences and other range improvements to a functional condition necessary to reasonably ensure compliance with annual operating instructions and subsequently, the terms and conditions of the grazing permit. Maps are included to spatially delineate projects.


The dilapidated fence that occurs in the Kendrick Mountain Wilderness Area between Bull Basin and Marlar Pastures will not be reconstructed. Instead, the Forest Service, in cooperation with the grazing permittee, will explore other options for pasture divisions (e.g., combining Marlar and Bull Basin Pastures).

All rebuilt fences must conform to wildlife standards where the bottom strand is smooth wire and 16-18" from the soil surface and the top wire is no greater than 42" from the soil surface.

Pasture boundary fence maintenance is to begin in Antelope Pasture, and be followed by BS Pasture, Allen Pasture, Platten Pasture, and Smoot Pasture, respectively. Progress of the work listed above will be assessed during your annual validation meetings (i.e., January-February), and again at the midway through the grazing season (i.e., June-July). If acceptable progress has been made, both parties would cooperatively plan the next pastures where maintenance would occur.

While range improvements are being upgraded, the Forest Service, in cooperation with the permittees, will consider needed adjustments in the grazing system/pasture rotation that may be necessary pending the upgrading of necessary range improvements to a functional state. For example, individual pastures may be excluded from grazing until fences are in a functional state.


