Type 1 Crews and Type 1 and 2 Helicopters are required to support indirect firing operations. Lack of DIVS, TFLD and HEQB limit ability to staff the expanding fire perimeter. Approximately 40,000 acres of timberland, of which 50% is private industry land, is threatened due to lack of containment opportunities in California. Fire experienced high temperatures and low RH contributing to extreme fire activity all night.
