Congratulations, you have been selected to attend Suburban Emergency Response sponsored by the Danny Rhynes Training Center, January 14-18, 2013. **Class will be held at the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Protection District, Station 174.** Class will begin at 0800 hours on Monday, January 14, and will end at approximately 1600 hours on Friday, January 18.

This course is designed to provide the student with a basic knowledge level to improve their performance during urban interface situations on the home unit. The class will be introduced to a variety of all-risk emergency incidents and students will be able to recognize hazardous situations that may arise in the urban interface. Students will learn appropriate actions to be implemented based upon current regulations, policies, fire suppression tactics and personal protective equipment currently in use.

Part of the curriculum requires students to participate in live fire exercises using Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA). Students will be required to meet OSHA standards concerning facial hair and SCBA use (CFR 1910.134(g)(1)(i)). The standard states that no facial hair growth of 24 hours or more that would come in contact with the seal of positive pressure SCBA will be allowed.

The following equipment is MANDATORY for attending class:

1. Agency approved STRUCTURE GEAR: structure helmet with chin strap and shroud, safety goggles, flash hood, structure coat, pants, boots, and structure gloves. Please have these items fitted to you with current SCBA Annual Certificate and Fit Test Record.
2. SELF CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS: complete and in working order, plus one spare tank.
3. Students bringing SCBA's with a low pressure system (2216 psi, or below 4500 psi) must bring a total of 2 bottles due to the lack of refilling stations in close proximity to the training facility.
4. SCBA Mask Fit Test certification or written approval from Fire Management Officer confirming individual is certified to don mask and is familiar with such equipment.
5. Bendix King Radio
5. **Full uniform attire is mandatory.** Please be groomed to obtain proper seal of SCBA's. Those who choose not to be groomed properly will not be able to participate in live fire exercises.

Students not showing up with proper Structure PPE will not participate in live fire events

Pre-Course work:

1. Prior to class, read "Forcible Entry" attachment and bring with you for discussion.

Tuition

Your tuition cost is **\$450.00**

All students must submit a NWCG Nomination Form with proper agency charge codes and signatures for payment. Forms can be attained on-line at: "nationalfiretraining.net."

Billing Information:

Forest Service (Other Regions): The approved NWCG Nomination Form will be used for payment. This form must include proper agency charge codes and signatures.

Other Federal Agencies: The approved NWCG Nomination Form will be used for payment. This form must include proper agency codes, agreement numbers and signatures.

Other Non Federal Agencies: It is recommended that students pay with check or money order at the facility at the start of class. There is an additional 8% administrative fee added to this tuition charge. If payment is not received, a bill of collection will be issued to your agency.

Cancellations: Cancellations must be made two weeks prior to the course start date. If a cancellation occurs after the two-week cut off and the slot goes unfilled, there will be a charge not to exceed the tuition charge for the course. **The last date to cancel for this course is December 31, 2012.**

If a student cancels within the two-week period and pre work has already been received, the student needs to return pre work to the training facility.

Dress: All students are **required** to wear an Agency uniform.
