## .DISCUSSION...

RELATIVE HUMIDITIES WILL BE 5 TO 10 PERCENT HIGHER THIS AFTERNOON DUE TO A LITTLE MORE OF A MARINE INFLUENCE ACROSS THE AREA IN THE WAKE OF AN UPPER LEVEL DISTURBANCE THAT MOVED THROUGH TUESDAY AFTERNOON AND EVENING. SOUTHWEST WINDS WILL STILL EXIST ALOFT, BUT WILL BE A BIT WEAKER THAN THOSE OBSERVED ON TUESDAY. WEDNESDAY EVENING WINDS ARE LIKELY TO BECOME NORTHWEST. WEDNESDAY NIGHT THERE WILL BE LIGHT OFFSHORE FLOW THAT WILL RESULT IN MODERATE TO POOR RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERIES THURSDAY MORNING. RELATIVE HUMIDITIES WILL THEN FALL OFF A BIT AS IT ALSO GETS A BIT HOTTER ON THURSDAY. LIGHT TO MODERATE OFFSHORE FLOW IS EXPECTED TO LIMIT RECOVERIES EACH NIGHT THROUGH THE WEEKEND, WITH THE MOST OFFSHORE WIND AND WORST RECOVERIES LIKELY TO OCCUR ON FRIDAY AND SATURDAY MORNINGS. HIGHS ARE EXPECTED TO PEAK ON SATURDAY AROUND 90. DRY WEATHER IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE FOR THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE.

**8. Medical Emergency Procedures**

1. Declare the nature of the emergency.
  - a. Medical injury/illness? If injury/illness is it life threatening? (Medical Transport vs. Medical Emergency)
2. If Life Threatening, request that the designated frequency be cleared for emergency traffic
3. Identify the On-Scene Incident Commander by Last name (i.e. Smith)
4. Identify nature of incident, number injured, patient assessment(s) and location (geographic and GPS coordinates)
5. Identify on-scene medical personnel by name (i.e. Jones)
6. Identify preferred method of patient transport
7. Request any additional resources and/or equipment needed
8. Document all information received and transmitted on the radio or phone
9. Identify any changes in the On-Scene IC or medical personnel as they occur





# Berry Point Fire Transportation Map
