

## CAUTIONS AND CONTACTS

- ✓ Road 500 is a single-lane dirt road built in the 1930s by the Forest Service with help from the Civilian Conservation Corps. It's known as the Lolo Motorway, a name from early days of automobile travel when people "motored" to their destinations.
- ✓ Many of today's passenger cars are too low to travel the road because of the potential of scraping on rocks that jut from the roadway. A 4-wheel drive vehicle is not a must as long as you drive slowly and cautiously.
- ✓ Towing a trailer is not recommended. In places you must be able to back up 1/4 mile to find a suitable passing place for an approaching vehicle.
- ✓ Driving an RV or motor home longer than 26 feet is not recommended. Overhanging branches, brush and trees can knock lights, air conditioners or other equipment off the top of the vehicle.

## MAKING RESERVATIONS

- Stay as many as seven nights. As of December 1, 2014, the rental fee is \$40.00 per night.

- Warm clothing and rain gear

- Binoculars, camera, first aid kit, matches
- Insect repellent, sun screen, toilet articles
- Lock combination
- Special Use Permit



# FOR RENT: LIZ BUTTE CABIN



Liz Butte Cabin is at an elevation of 6098 feet in a landscape dominated by lodgepole pine, scattered fir trees and beargrass.

## *How to get there*

### *From Lewiston, Idaho:*

Travel east on U.S. Highway 12 to Kamiah, Idaho (66 miles). Once you cross the bridge over the Clearwater River, you're 2 and 1/2 hours from the lookout.

Make a sharp left turn onto Woodland Road. Stay on this road until you come to the second road to the right (Forest Road 100), then turn.

Travel about 22 miles to Lolo Campground. Continue on the road another 5 and 1/4 miles to the junction with Forest Road 103.

Turn onto Road 103 and follow it for 15 miles to Beaver Dam Saddle.

At the junction, turn right onto Forest Road 104. Stay on this road for nearly 1 mile until you reach the junction with Forest Road 500.

Make a sharp left turn onto Road 500. Travel about 14 miles along this road to the intersection with Forest Road 560.

Travel about 2 miles on Road 560 to Liz Butte Cabin.

### *From Greer, Idaho:*

Turn off Highway 12 at Greer, crossing the bridge over the Clearwater River. You're about 2 and 1/2 hours from the lookout.

Travel State Highway 11 to Weippe (17 miles). When you get into town, go straight onto a county road instead of staying on Highway 11, which makes a sweeping left curve.

Stay on the county road to the junction with Road 100. Veer right onto Road 100 and continue traveling until you reach the junction with Road 103.

Turn left and proceed as described in "How to get there from Lewiston, Idaho."

### *From Missoula, Montana:*

Travel south on U.S. Highway 93 to Lolo, Montana.

Turn right and travel west on U.S. Highway 12 to Kamiah, Idaho (152 miles).

Before you cross the bridge over the Clearwater River, turn right onto Woodland Road. When you come to the second road to the right (Forest Road 100), turn.

Follow directions detailed in "How to get there from Lewiston, Idaho."
