

Operational Period – 8/21-22/2012 24 hr 0600-0600</p> <p>Management Objective:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Implement good risk management practices in order to provide for firefighter, other responder and public safety. Use good risk analysis processes, the principles of the 10 Standard Fire Orders, LCEs and the 18 Watch-Out Situations as the foundation for risk decisions at all levels. • Use aggressive outreach to insure timely and accurate dissemination of information regarding fire related activities is provided to the public, land owners, cooperators, elected officials and other stakeholders. • Utilize efficient and effective business practices to manage the fire cost, which should be in alignment with the identified values to be protected. Cost to be tracked in accordance with the approved cost share agreement. • Ensure that relationships are maintained or enhanced with local land owners, business owners, the general public and other key stakeholders. • Coordinate with ODF, the District and Forests resources regarding resource considerations, and WFDSS inputs. • Develop strategies that have high probability of success for the overall suppression efforts on the incident. <p>Operational Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to implement strategies for engaging the fire that will help ensure coordinated efforts for mission success. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Implement identified actions at the appropriate time to allow for the right operational tempo to accomplish mission and reduce risk to fire fighters. ○ Where it can be safely done, minimize acreage burned, damage to private property and improvements. ○ Utilize resource advisors for input to help minimize environmental concerns related to operational activities. ○ Assess daily the validity of the strategy and tactics and assure planned tactics will meet suppression objectives. ○ Implement guidelines provided in the Barry Point Turnback Standards Plan. • Utilizing operational strategies and tactics that minimize, impacts to private lands and structures, resource damage, economic impacts, and minimize the disruption to local activities and businesses where practical: • Provide timely initial attack assistance to the forest and local agencies within the TFR or as requested. <p>Commanders Intent: To meet the intent of these objectives to provide the highest level of customer services for all involved with or affected by the incident, all incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintaining good situational awareness within the sphere of their established work areas. • Personal interactions with others both inside and outside the incident management organization or incident operational areas. • Managing an incident-within-an-incident and familiarities with medical extraction points. • Establishing and maintaining good 360-degree communications structures to ensure all critical and important messages reach the appropriate people in a timely manner. <p>Strategy: The Barry Point incident management strategy is based on “Values at Risk.” Firefighters, the public and other incident responders being the highest value. We will engage the fire on our terms at the appropriate tempo, where probability of success is high and the risk is acceptable. A combination of tactics will be employed with consideration of values at risk noted above as well as communities, private property, and infrastructure. Tactical actions are based on the principles of point defense and a mix direct / in-direct effort as dictated by the situation.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">The following are guiding principles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Right Plan (i.e., as informed by the Risk Decision Framework) • In the Right Place (i.e., where we have a reasonable probability of success) • At the Right Time (i.e., when we have favorable conditions for efficient and effective suppression) • With the Right Assets (i.e., those suppression assets needed to safely implement tactics in support of reasonable objectives) • For the Right Duration (i.e., release resources as soon as they are no longer needed)

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level trough will approach the area today and pass to the east during the evening hours. As this trough passes, winds higher in the atmosphere are expected to mix down during the heat of the day, mid-afternoon into early evening, generating gusts of 20 to 30 mph across portions of the fire area, mainly Branches 1 & 4 and across higher ridges. While the trough will cool temperatures around 5 degrees through the day, minimum RH values will still dip into the middle teens.



INPUTS

FUELS

Fuels in the fire area are primarily composed of cured grass, mixed grass and brush (less than 2 ft. tall), and timber with understory. Primary timber species include mixed-sized Ponderosa Pine, Western Juniper, and True Fir (at higher elevations). Brush and understory includes Mountain Mahogany, Bitterbrush, conifer dog-hair thickets, sagebrush, and Ceonothus (at higher elevations). Snags are common throughout timbered areas and may contribute to spotting. Live fuels will contribute to fire intensity and rate of spread.

FIRE BEHAVIOR INPUTS

Windier conditions will test containment lines today. Daytime temperatures and humidity will continue to allow for flare-ups in the interior of the fire. Spotting will occur if flare-ups are next to containment lines. Rates of spread on open fire perimeters will continue to increase. Fire behavior will respond quickly to wind influences. For tonight, expect cool temperature and good humidity recovery which will minimize fire behavior. Spotting potential will decline rapidly after dark. Again, wind will override RH and fuel moisture.

- * Fine fuel moisture of 4% (exposed fuels) and 7% (shaded fuels) today.
 - * Fine fuel moisture nearing or surpassing 15% tonight.
 - * Probability of Ignition (PIG) 80% today, 15-30% tonight.

All divisions are in varied stages of improve, mop-up, patrol. Pockets of unburned fuel near containment lines are still a concern. Spotting potential will be very low after midnight but smoldering spots become active spots during the day. Any torching tree near containment lines are threats to containment. Snags will continue to be a hazard. Depth of mop-up is critical when reducing the threat of spotting.

****GUSTY WINDS will amplify spread rates and increase spotting. Watch the wind.****

****Observed flare-ups yesterday were in the crowns of trees within 10-15 minutes****


- Gather information on Situational Awareness




