Job Vacancy: The Hoosier National Forest will be filling a temporary position. The selected applicant will serve as a **GS-0462-3 Forestry Aid (General)** on the Brownstown Ranger District in Bedford, Indiana. The work schedule is full-time for the summer and the salary is **\$12.06/hour**. The selected applicant will earn four hours of sick leave and four hours of annual leave per pay period. The start and end dates are negotiable. The start date will likely fall between April 1st and May 15th. The end date will likely fall between August 15th and October 1st, 2013. Actual dates will be agreed upon when a candidate is selected. No government housing is available; however there are rental opportunities in the cities of Bedford and Bloomington.

The Position: Duties will include trail and recreation maintenance. The candidate will work closely with Forest recreation and wilderness staff. This position will require working outdoors in various terrain and weather conditions. The selected candidate will report to the Forest Supervisor's Office located in Bedford. Interested applicants must possess a valid driver's license.

To Apply: This position is being filled through an open, continuous, on-line application process. While there is no deadline for applying, however, interested individuals need to have their application in no later than February 22nd, 2013.

Applicants can go to www.usajobs.gov and under "search jobs" enter the announcement number TEMPOCR-0462-03-GEN-DT. Click on the position title link and an "apply online" button will become available for creating a profile and applying for the position. **Bedford, Indiana MUST be selected as the duty station.**
