Special Benefits



This property is located within the boundaries of the Giant Sequoia National Monument in the Black Mountain Giant Sequoia Grove. The 60 acre parcel is surrounded on all sides by National Forest System lands and has numerous second growth Giant Sequoia trees.

Acquisition of this property provides an increased buffer between Forest Service land and private property, helping to protect water quality and riparian habitat values associated with the Tule River.

This acquisition would not have been possible with the multi-year logistical support and purchase of the property by Save the Redwoods League.


