<b>Management Objective:</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Implement good risk management practices in order to provide for firefighter, other responder and public safety. Use good risk analysis processes, the principles of the 10 Standard Fire Orders, LCES and the 18 Watch-Out Situations as the foundation for risk decisions at all levels.</li> <li>• Use aggressive outreach to insure timely and accurate dissemination of information regarding fire related activities is provided to the public, land owners, cooperators, elected officials and other stakeholders.</li> <li>• Utilize efficient and effective business practices to manage the fire cost, which should be in alignment with the identified values to be protected. Cost to be tracked in accordance with the approved cost share agreement.</li> <li>• Ensure that relationships are maintained or enhanced with local land owners, business owners, the general public and other key stakeholders.</li> <li>• Coordinate with ODF, the District and Forests resources regarding resource considerations, and WFDSS inputs.</li> <li>• Develop strategies that have high probability of success for the overall suppression efforts on the incident.</li> </ul>			
<b>Operational Objectives:</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Continue to implement strategies for engaging the fire that will help ensure coordinated efforts for mission success. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Implement identified actions at the appropriate time to allow for the right operational tempo to accomplish mission and reduce risk to fire fighters.</li> <li>○ Where it can be safely done, minimize acreage burned, damage to private property and improvements.</li> <li>○ Utilize resource advisors for input to help minimize environmental concerns related to operational activities.</li> <li>○ Assess daily the validity of the strategy and tactics and assure planned tactics will meet suppression objectives.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Utilizing operational strategies and tactics that minimize, impacts to private lands and structures, resource damage, economic impacts, and minimize the disruption to local activities and businesses where practical:</li> <li>• Provide timely initial attack assistance to the forest and local agencies within the TFR or as requested.</li> </ul>			
<b>Commanders Intent:</b> To meet the intent of these objectives to provide the highest level of customer services for all involved with or affected by the incident, all incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintaining good situational awareness within the sphere of their established work areas.</li> <li>• Personal interactions with others both inside and outside the incident management organization or incident operational areas.</li> <li>• Managing an incident-within-an-incident and familiarities with medical extraction points.</li> <li>• Establishing and maintaining good 360-degree communications structures to ensure all critical and important messages reach the appropriate people in a timely manner.</li> </ul>			
<b>Strategy:</b> The Barry Point incident management strategy is based on "Values at Risk." Firefighters, the public and other incident responders being the highest value. We will engage the fire on our terms at the appropriate tempo, where probability of success is high and the risk is acceptable. A combination of tactics will be employed with consideration of values at risk noted above as well as communities, private property, and infrastructure. Tactical actions are based on the principles of point defense and a mix direct / in-direct effort as dictated by the situation.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The <b>Right Plan</b> (i.e., as informed by the Risk Decision Framework)</li> <li>• In the <b>Right Place</b> (i.e., where we have a reasonable probability of success)</li> <li>• At the <b>Right Time</b> (i.e., when we have favorable conditions for efficient and effective suppression)</li> <li>• With the <b>Right Assets</b> (i.e., those suppression assets needed to safely implement tactics in support of reasonable objectives)</li> <li>• For the <b>Right Duration</b> (i.e., release resources as soon as they are no longer needed)</li> </ul>



**SPECIFIC:**

**DIV A, B, C, D, AA, M, N, Z** Patrol, improve and Mop-up.

**DIV E, F, G** Where fuels are continuous expect fairly rapid rates of spread, nearing 50 ft/min, where there is open, unchecked fire perimeter. Look for opportunities to tie lines into sparse fuels and natural barriers such as rock sprees. Fire may be less intense in these divisions but expect rapid rates of spread anywhere topography and wind align. Individual torching trees will result in spotting.

**DIV L** Expect pretty active fire behavior as interior islands continue to burnout, especially around Fitzwater. Expect winds to be gusty and erratic under the threat of thunderstorms. Unlined fire edge will be active and very receptive to wind influences.

**DIV J** Increased humidity and lower temps will help reduce the threat of spotting. This will give crews a higher success rate in lining and holding open fire edges. Fuels are still very dry and wind can override the humidity. Thunderstorms will bring gusty and erratic winds and fire behavior will increase rapidly during those periods if there is no precipitation.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Thunderstorm development is likely in the afternoon.

**FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY**

Thunderstorms pose a significant threat to control lines. Fire behavior will respond rapidly. Gusty winds will bring down snags. Review thunderstorm safety in the IRPG.

Thunderstorms Thunder storms pose several significant risks.

- Use the thunder storm guidelines in the IRPG, page 19.
- Review IMET Weather forecast with crew members
- Post lookouts for incoming cells.
- Beware of down draft risks (increased fire behavior, snags, etc.)
- Preplan your escape routes due to slippery roads, flash floods.

Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones

- Assign experienced firefighters to be your lookouts. Make sure they can see the fire AND your work area. Communicate frequently to maintain your situational awareness.
- Make sure you can also communicate with your crewmembers, division supervisor, adjacent forces, and Arapaho Communications.
- Find, flag, and brief the location of escape routes before engaging the fire. Always have a Plan B if your primary escape route is compromised. Estimate escape time based on the slowest crewmember.
- Be realistic about how big your safety zone needs to be. If you need to use it, the fire will be up and moving and probably a lot hotter than when you went in to work the fireline. You should be able to stay in the safety zone without needing a fire shelter.

Fireline Leadership

- Provide effective briefings.
- Give clear instructions.
- Check for understanding and ask for feedback.
- Provide leader's intent.
- When issuing instructions, explain:
  - Task,
  - Purpose,
  - End State.
- Resources know where to go and what to do if conditions change.
