ANTHONY LAKES AREA GRANDE RONDE LAKE SNO-PARKS



General Information:

The Grande Ronde Lake Sno-Park is located 40 miles northwest of Baker City, Oregon, and 45 miles Southwest from La Grande, Oregon.

From this site you can enjoy over 150 miles of trails to ride, snowshoe or ski from, or downhill ski at Anthony Lakes Mountain Resort.

The Anthony Lakes area boasts some of the best powder snow conditions in the State.

Site Features & Services

- **Permit:** OR/WA Sno-Park permit required
- **Potable Water :** None on site
- **Elevation:** 7100'
- **No. and type of sites:**
 - **Anthony Lakes:** Parking for 150 vehicles
 - **Grande Ronde:** Parking for 10 vehicles with trailers
- **Road Access:** paved
- **Accessible sites:** None
- **Facilities:** Vault toilet at the Grand Ronde parking area; restroom, lounge, restaurant at the Anthony Lakes Lodge
- **HOST:** None

Use: Moderate during the week; heavy on weekends and holidays

Access: From Interstate 84 turn north from Baker City, Oregon (or south from La Grande, Oregon) take the North Powder exit and follow the signs west on the Anthony Lakes highway approximately 20 miles to the Ski Area.

This Sno-park has 2 attached parking areas. The first area is for use associated with the Anthony Lakes Ski Area, and the second one is located further down Forest road 73 towards Grande Ronde Lake and is used primarily for snowmobile use.

Attractions: The Anthony Lakes Ski Area Sno-park is primarily used for activities associated with the ski area (Alpine and Nordic skiing, snowboarding, and snowshoeing)

Considerations: Snowmobile routes are groomed and signed by the local snowmobile clubs (Sumpter Valley Snowmobilers, La Grande Snowdrifters), in agreement with the Forest Service. Please remember, grooming and trail conditions can change rapidly according to the weather.

Restrictions: Use of the designated runs and cross-country trails within the Anthony Lakes Ski Area requires a pass. For more information on the Ski Area please visit their website: www.anthonylakes.com
