

**Difficult**  
Steepness: Much of the trail has grades of 20% or steeper.  
Length: Trails are usually more than eight miles, but short, steep trails may be included.  
Terrain: Trail is most likely rocky, with uneven footing. It is in many stream crossings.

but it cannot always be relied upon to work, and it cannot replace good planning.  
Use your cell phone to call for help only in a true emergency. Before making the call, make sure that you have done everything you can to help yourself or your group.  
Because of limitations with coverage, 911 may not be able to call you back. Plan to call 911 back in 15 minutes and every half-hour afterward unless directed otherwise. It is important that you give the 911 operator every important detail, since your battery may go dead, or you may be impossible to reach.

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**If a Bear is Sighted**

- Never surround or corner a bear.
- Stay back and keep children close.
- If approached by a bear, yell, bang pots and pans, and throw rocks.
