The Sawtooth National Forest is currently seeking a candidate for a Natural Resources Student Intern GS-02, Part Time position.

ABOUT THE POSITION(S): This position is an entry level Intern position working for the Forest Service Mining Engineer Stationed on the Forest. Applicants must be a current High School or undergraduate student in good academic standing who will be returning to high school or attending college as an undergraduate or graduate student in the fall of 2013. The position will be located on the Sawtooth National Forest with duty station in Malta, Idaho. Government housing *shall not* be available. Principle duties will include:

- Changing sprinkler lines at the Black Pine Mine near Juniper, Idaho
- Preparing water volume reports for the irrigation site
- Calculating water flow rates
- Maintaining the drip line irrigation system
- Doing minor fence maintenance

The anticipated start date for this position is mid-May through December 2013. It is anticipated the student trainee will work at the site on a part time basis for 3 to 4 hours per day.
