

What 2 activities can I do?

- Attend any Interpretive Program at the Grand Mesa Visitor Center or any program given by a Forest Service employee.
- Visit the Lands End Observatory
- Visit the Grand Mesa Visitor Center

- Other activities, such as: hiking, fishing, camping, horseback riding, ATV/motorcycle/bicycle riding, drive the Grand Mesa Scenic Byway, have a family picnic, take pictures of wildflowers and identify, find animal tracks, take pictures of your activities.
