

Lamborn Trail #894



The Lamborn Trail #894 starts just south of Bell Creek Springs and climbs up between Mt. Lamborn and Landsend. After passing between the two mountains and passing an intersection with the Mt. Lamborn Trail #895 it contours through the aspen until it intersects with the Inter-Ocean Pass Trail #890.

This trail along with trail #895 provides a relatively easy access to those wanting to climb Mt. Lamborn or Landsend.

Trail Ethics:

The Lamborn Trail is maintained for foot, horse and bicycle travel. Please don't cut across switchbacks or create new trails.



Motors & Machines:

Motorized vehicles are not allowed on the Lamborn Trail.



Drinking Water:

DONOT drink water directly from a river or stream. Water needs to be treated first by either filtering, boiling for at least 10 minutes or treated with iodine tablets.



Multiple use:

As you use this area you may notice that the Forest is managed for a broad range of uses. Recreation use alone includes hiking, horseback riding, hunting, snowmobiling and sightseeing. In addition, the vegetation in the Forest requires some form of management. Timber harvest and livestock grazing are both forms of land management you may encounter while using this area. The livestock grazing on this area is managed in a very progressive and specific manner. The fences and gates that you may see are critical to managing the livestock and meeting the resource objectives that are planned for this area. Please close all gates that you open as you travel through the area. Controlling the livestock in the manner that we have planned is important.



Be prepared for inclement weather at all times.

Familiarize yourself with the area.

Trail Beginning: Lamborn Trail Trailhead at the end of Forest Road #834.

Trail Ending: The intersection with the Inter-Ocean Pass Trail #890.

Access #1: From the town of Paonia, follow Onarga Ave. past Don's Market and continue south, after crossing the Rail Road tracks, Onarga will turn into Lamborn Mesa Rd. Turn Right at the Stop onto Stewart Mesa Rd. (Stewart Mesa Rd. eventually turns right..."DO NOT TURN RIGHT"... watch for signs that show Stewart Mesa and 40/50 Rd.) Continue Straight onto 40/50 Rd. This will turn in to gravel and end at L50 Rd. Turn Left onto L50 Rd. and follow it until you reach the McCluskey Wildlife Area. After crossing the cattle guard into the McCluskey Wildlife Area there will be parking on the left past the power line tower. If towing a horse trailer or ATV trailer, you should park here and unload. Full size high clearance vehicles without trailers can drive to the Trail Head in dry conditions. After leaving the parking lot you will come to a Y, stay to the left. At the second Y here is a "Lamborn Trail 3 Miles" sign, again stay to your left. The road enters National Forest when it crosses a cattle guard and becomes Forest Service Road #834. There is another sign, "Lamborn Trail 1 Mile" and the road turns to the right. Continue on FSR #834 for the last mile to the Trail Head. This road




is very rocky, rutted and narrow in some places and can scratch a full size vehicles where the oak



Dispersed Camping
Dispersed camping is permitted in most areas of the Forest. Recreation maps are available at all local Forest Service offices and personnel can answer questions on specific sites. Camping in undeveloped areas requires more from the camper to help keep the site in the condition in which it was found. If you Pack it in-Pack it out!



Fire Safety:
Check in with your local Forest Service office to see if fire bans are in effect.
