Directions to Free Campgrounds

Hartley Springs: This is an easy-to-find campground – there is a campground sign on the highway. Turn west on Glass Flow Road. Go about 1 mile to find the sign for Hartley Springs.

Big Springs: Turn east at Owens River Road. After descending a hill turn left to the campsites, which can be seen from the road. It's a little more than 2 miles to the campground from US 395.

Glass Creek: Turn west opposite the CalTrans Crestview Maintenance Yard. The campground is a half mile down the road.

Deadman: A little more than a half mile south of the CalTrans Crestview Maintenance Yard, turn west on Deadman Creek Road. It's 4 to 5 miles to the campsites.
