Dear Prospective Offeror:

The Forest Service will receive technical and price proposals (no public opening) at the Umpqua National Forest no later than 1:00 p.m. local time on or before June 3, 2013 for the Oak Flats Stew Contract. This contract is located in T.26S., R.2E., Sections 24, 25 and 36; T.26S., R.3E., Sections 30 and 31, W.M., unsurveyed, Douglas County, Oregon. Contract Form FS-2400-13 will be used. The termination date for this contract is March 31, 2018.

This Stewardship Contract includes the removal of timber and the completion of 7 restoration service type projects meant to improve ecological conditions within the Umpqua National Forest. All mandatory stewardship work items shall be performed. Contractor will earn stewardship credits equal to the value of service work completed and accepted that will offset an equal amount of stumpage required to be paid by the contractor.

There are 1.42 miles of specified road reconstruction. A specified road construction cost of \$15,225.23 has been allowed in the appraisal for this work.

The minimum acceptable bid for advertised timber is \$27.94 per Ton for biddable species.

A bid guarantee is not required.

Bidders are required to submit a Bid Price/Best Value proposal for this contract. Contract award will be based on a determination of which proposal constitutes the best value to the Government. Proposals will be submitted in two parts and will include a Technical and a Price Proposal. Details on what to include in the proposals are stated in the Bid Form. Award will be made to the bidder whose offer is both technically acceptable and whose technical/price relationship is the most advantageous to the Government. The Government may, when in its interest, reject any or all offers or waive any informality in bids received. A written award mailed, or otherwise furnished to the successful Bidder, shall be deemed to result in a binding contract without further action by either party.

A meeting for prospective offerors to discuss objectives and requirements and review the projects and contract and to discuss technical proposals for both the Timber Harvest and Stewardship Projects will be held on May 2, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. local time, at the Oak Flats Stew Project Area. A carpool will leave the North Umpqua Ranger District, 18782 North Umpqua Highway, Glide, Oregon 97443 at 9:00 a.m. to travel to the Project Area.
