Existing and Potential Leases on the National Forests in Alabama



The National Forests in Alabama is comprised of approximately 666,000 acres and 543,047 acres are available for lease.

The Forest Service gave the BLM the consent to offer oil and gas leases many times in the past. Dating back to 1969, leases have been offered for sale on every Forest within Alabama with the exception of the Tuskegee National Forest.

Currently, 71,944 acres are under oil and gas lease on the Conecuh National Forest and 5,361 acres on the Oakmulgee Ranger District of the Talladega National Forest.

At present, there are 3 active wells on the Conecuh National Forest.

Recent Expressions of Interest (EOIs) from potential leasers have been received by the Bureau of Land Management. These areas are highlighted on the Bankhead National Forest and the Conecuh National Forest maps.
