Statement of Need:

The Umatilla National Forest has road repairs and culvert replacement occurring on FSR 5506. Contractors will have the entire road demolished at various times throughout the 30 day project making it impassable. For public safety reasons, the road will be closed during the week.

Enforcement Procedures: The temporary regulation will be enforced on an observed basis and by Forest Protection Officers and other employees. No special procedures are established.


Posting:



Forest Road 5506 Closure Order

UMATILLA NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are temporarily prohibited in the area described in this order within the Umatilla National Forest, from May 6, 2013 until June 7, 2013.


1. Being on the road. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to the National Forest System roads and/or segments listed in Appendix A of this order listed below and attached maps.
36CFR 261.54 (e)

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50 (e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. An Forest Service Employee when performing official duties

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571)
