## *Colville National Forest Nature-Watch Walk Saturday May 18*

**Colville, WA**—Join Wildlife Biologist Mike Borysewicz on a naturalist's tour of the Elk Creek Trail. Participants will see an old prescribed burn heavily used by elk, a cascading waterfall, and a wildflower meadow on this delightful two-mile-long loop trail. There will be spectacular views from the meadow at the half-way point. Meet at the Elk Creek Trailhead at 10:00 a.m. within the Mill Pond Historic Site about 5 miles east of Metaline Falls on County Road 9345. Bring a lunch, a hat, and sturdy walking shoes. If you have questions about the walk, call the Sullivan Lake Ranger Station at (509) 446-7500. Nature-Watch activities are free and sponsored by the Colville National Forest. Nature-Watch is a cooperative effort of federal, state, and private partners to foster the conservation of wildlife, fish, wildflowers, and their habitats.

Elk Creek Trail Head. Five miles east of Metaline Falls on County Road 9345. The Trail Head is located at the Mill Pond historic site northwest of Sullivan Lake.
