



Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Supported Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) crew who:
 - ✓ Constructed 300 feet of buck and pole fence and repaired the perimeter fence at Sugar Creek Campground.
 - ✓ Constructed a rock wall along the asphalt path to the fishing platform at Walton Lake Campground.
 - ✓ Pruned and thinned vegetation at Ochoco Divide Campground.
 - ✓ Repaired 210 feet of fencing at Deep Creek Campground.
- Replaced site markers, removed two large, wooden racks and cleared brush around sites and along roads in Sugar Creek Campground.
- Repaired the sign board, replaced site markers, anchored to picnic tables and cleared brush around sites and along roads in Wolf Creek Campground.
- Repaired the sign board, replaced site markers, removed two large, wooden racks, anchored one table and cleared brush along 400 feet of footpath in Deep Creek Campground.
- Replaced eight fire rings, 39 barrier posts and a picnic table; added gravel around 17 fire rings; refurbished six, replaced one and anchored 17 tables; and upgraded one site to improve its accessibility at Wildcat Campground.
- Anchored 29 tables at Skull Hollow Campground.
- Refurbished 11 tables and replaced seven log barriers and two windows in the toilet building at Antelope Reservoir Campground.

Special Feature

In the shade of Ponderosa pine and Douglas firs on the banks of Mill Creek is Wildcat Campground. This campground is a great base camp for explorations into Mill Creek Wilderness and offers amazing trout fishing in the creek. Recently, upgrades to the campground included construction of an accessible campsite and an access route to a popular day use area adjacent to it.


