



Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees:

- Supported campground hosts who completed cleaning and maintenance tasks, and provided visitor information and assistance at campgrounds, picnic areas, cabins and trailheads.
- Identified and removed hazard trees, tested drinking water at nine sites, and completed maintenance and cleaning tasks at fee sites.
- Supported twice weekly compliance patrols throughout the summer at 51 camping and trailhead sites.
- Completed pre-season safety review and maintenance, and tested drinking water systems at 32 campgrounds.
- Installed vent screens to prevent birds from getting trapped in buildings and vaults on 21 campground restrooms.
- Replaced 12 fire rings and ten picnic tables at six campgrounds.
- Repaired two restrooms at Oregon Campground and added gravel to improve accessibility of a path.
- Improved access by adding gravel to five campsites pads and parking areas at Elk Creek Campground and two campsites at McCully Forks Campground.
- Repainted information boards at Birdtrack, Moss Springs, West Eagle, Bick Creek and Spoolcart campgrounds.
- Repaired dock walkway decking at Pittsburg Landing Boat Launch.
- Repaired major water damage to Kirkwood Historic Ranch restroom: Replaced the flooring, toilet valves and water lines.
- Provided year-round operations at Kirkwood Historic Ranch and seasonal operations at Cache Creek Ranch.



The Hells Canyon Creek Visitor Center and Boat Launch provide area interpretation and year-round river access for visitors.

Wallowa-Whitman Additional Accomplishments

- Administered and monitored field operations of over 35 outfitter and guides and three snowmobile and dog sled races recreation events in Hells Canyon National Recreation Area and Eagle Cap Wilderness.
- Completed annual pre-season safety review, maintenance and cleaning tasks, and tested propane and water lines at Two Color, Antlers, Peavy, and Anthony Lakes guard stations.
- Installed a new gate, replaced the grey water sump and purchased new sheets, bed covers and curtains for Peavy Guard Station.
- Partnered with volunteers from Blue Mountain Backcountry Riders and Alpine Huts and maintained over 40 miles of trail in Eagle Cap Wilderness area.
