

FOREST ORDER

USDA FOREST SERVICE
RIO GRANDE NATIONAL FORESTRoad and Trailhead Closure
FSR 949 and South Crestone/Willow Lake Trailhead

Pursuant to 16 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 551 and 36 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.) § 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on FSR (Forest Service Road) 949 (the "Restricted Road") and the South Crestone/Willow Lake Trailhead and on the areas within 300 feet of the center line of the Restricted Road and within 300 feet of the Trailhead (the "Restricted Areas") on the Saguache Ranger District of the Rio Grande National Forest, Saguache County, State of Colorado.

The Restricted Road and the Restricted Areas are further defined as being located in Section 8 and 9, T43N, R12E. The Restricted Road and Areas are depicted on the attached map hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

This Closure Order is necessary to protect the public for health and safety, while construction workers make improvements to FSR 949 and the South Crestone/Willow Lake Trailhead.

PROHIBITIONS:

- 1) Going into or being upon the Restricted Area. 36 C.F.R. § 261.53(e)
- 2) Being on the Restricted Road. 36 C.F.R. § 261.54(e)


EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

- 1) Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force engaged in the performance of an official duty;
- 2) Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.

This Order will be in effect from 12:00 AM, Wednesday, May 29, 2013 and shall remain in effect until rescinded or until July 3, 2013, whichever event occurs first.

Violations of these regulations is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. 16 U.S.C § 551 and 18 U.S.C. §§ 3571 and 3559.
