## DESCRIPTION/SPECIFICATIONS

### GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

#### SCOPE OF CONTRACT

This contract requires furnishing equipment on a fully operated basis, in good mechanical and operating condition and operated by competent operators, experienced in performing work of the nature required by this contract. The Contracting Officer will require a brief resume, in the event the operator has not previously operated an excavator on the Gallatin National Forest. The Contractor will provide all equipment, operating supplies, operators, supervision, and support functions necessary to perform the required work on a per hour basis.

#### DESCRIPTION

The work to be accomplished is associated with trail building and maintenance, which shall include but is not limited to, building new trail prism, blading, widening and shaping trail surfaces, building and cleaning grade dips and drainage ditches, removing rock, logs and debris.

#### LOCATION

The work is located on various trails on the Gallatin National Forest. The following is a list of estimated hours anticipated, to build or maintain trails under the contract. The list may be adjusted during the working period as priorities and conditions change.

- (b) The bidder secures an inspection by a qualified mechanic employed by factory authorized repair facility for warranty purposes or an authorized dealer, for the make of equipment being offered;
- (c) The mechanic completes the Inspection Form (EXHIBIT B) and certifies that the equipment is in good operating and mechanical condition;
- (d) The bidder must have submitted the completed inspection form as part of the bid in response to this Solicitation.

This inspection does not affect the Government's right to make additional inspections of the equipment or to contact the inspector concerning the inspection performed.

**SAFETY REQUIREMENTS**

(a) Contractor shall provide two signs stating "Machinery Ahead" with stands. Signs shall be a minimum of 36" x 36" in size with 6" black lettering on an orange background, reflectorized. Signs shall be in good condition and lettering shall be legible. Signs shall conform to U.S. Department of Transportation "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" (MUTCD), sign W21-3. (See Exhibit A). Signs shall be posted at the beginning and end of the daily work area before work begins. Signs shall be removed at the end of each work day, except as noted in paragraph (b).

(b) If a berm is left in a roadway overnight or weekends due to weather conditions or equipment breakdowns, the Contractor shall place a Type I barricade with an operable Type B illuminated warning light at each end of the berm and at maximum spacing intervals of 1000 feet. These devices shall conform to MUTCD

(see Exhibit A). If it is necessary to leave a berm in place over a weekend, the Contractor shall notify the COR or inspector within 3 hours of the cause.

## **SOIL MOISTURE**

Equipment use may be suspended when soil moisture conditions are not favorable for obtaining a satisfactory result. Suitable moisture conditions are determined to be in excess of five percent and less than 15 percent by weight of the material being bladed unless otherwise authorized by the COR.

### **ADDITIONAL INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE REQUIREMENTS**

(a) Inspection of Equipment. Equipment will be inspected at the time it is delivered to the worksite. Equipment that does not meet contract specifications and requirements shall be rejected.

(b) Rejected and Replacement Equipment. If equipment is rejected for non-compliance with the specifications, the Contractor will be notified in writing to correct the deficiencies or furnish replacement equipment meeting specifications within two calendar days. If accepted equipment becomes inoperative, the Contractor shall be required to correct the deficiencies within two calendar days. Failure to repair or replace the equipment in the two calendar days may result in the termination of the Contractor's right to proceed. If accumulated down-time due to equipment breakdown exceeds 10 percent of the working days for that item the Contractor's right to proceed may be terminated.

(c) Dependent Equipment. If any piece of equipment becomes inoperative and prevents a dependent piece of equipment from doing productive work, then no payment will be made for any dependent equipment until affected equipment resumes operation. However, authorized time for all equipment shall apply towards meeting the hours shown in the Schedule of Items.

The working days shown are sufficient to accomplish the estimated hours of work plus an allowance of approximately 15 percent for lost time due to weather, breakdown, being stuck, and other problems. In the event the Contractor fails to accomplish the estimated hours of work within the working days, and a need for the equipment still exists, the Government may allow the contract time to continue.

### **METHOD OF MEASUREMENT**

An hour consists of 60 minutes of actual operation of equipment on authorized Government work. Moving of equipment under its own power, when so ordered by the Contracting Officer, (except move-in-move-out) will constitute authorized work. Nonproductive time such as, but not restricted to, lack of operating supplies or qualified operator, service time, time lost by reason of breakdown or being stuck, or loading time of specified accessories shall not constitute "actual operation."

(a) Moving Between Job Locations and Standby. Moving of equipment and specified accessories between job locations shall be at Government expense and paid for at the hourly rate. Moving of support equipment and personnel between job locations shall be at Contractor's expense.

### **VARIATION IN ESTIMATED QUANTITY**

It is mutually agreed some changes in the estimated quantities may be necessary during the course of the contract. It is the essence of the contract to recognize a normal and expected margin of change within the meaning of the "Changes - Time-and-Materials or Labor-Hours" clause of FAR 52.243-3 as not requiring or permitting any adjustment of contract prices, except:

(a) If the estimated quantity of any item is increased to more than 125 percent of the quantity stated in The Schedule, either party to the contract, upon demand, may be entitled to an equitable adjustment on the quantity above 125 percent.

(b) If the estimated quantity of any item is reduced to less than 75 percent of the quantity stated in The Schedule, either party to the contract, upon demand, may be entitled to an equitable adjustment for the quantity actually performed and accepted.

### **DAILY RECORD**

The Government will maintain a daily record on **Shift Tickets** for each piece of equipment showing:

(a) Contract number and bid item number applicable to the equipment.

(b) Name of Contractor

(c) Hours of operation authorized for payment to nearest quarter hour.

(d) Hours of actual operation will be maintained by Forest Service COR or inspector. Payments will be based on COR and/or inspector's records.

(e) Authorized hours of operation lost and reason.

## **BASIS OF PAYMENT**

The daily record will constitute the basis for calculating the sum due the Contractor. Contractor shall submit and invoice for payment at the end of each 15 calendar day period. Payment due the Contractor at the end of each 15 calendar day period will be made as soon after the close of the period as practicable.

## **LANDSCAPE PRESERVATION**

(a) The Contractor shall confine operations to within the clearing limits or other areas designated in contract documents, and prevent the depositing of rocks, excavated materials, stumps, or other debris outside of these limits. Material which falls outside of these limits shall be retrieved, disposed of, or incorporated in the work as directed by the Contracting Officer.

(b) Operation shall be scheduled and conducted to minimize erosion of soils and to prevent silting and muddying of streams, rivers, irrigation systems, and impoundments (lakes, reservoirs, etc.).

Pollutants such as fuels, lubricants, bitumens, raw sewage, and other harmful materials shall not be discharged into or near rivers, streams, and impoundments or into natural or man-made channels leading thereto. Wash water or waste water from concrete or aggregate operations shall not be allowed to enter live streams prior to treatment by filtration, settling, or other means sufficient to reduce the sediment content to not more than that of the stream into which it is discharged.

Mechanized equipment shall not be operated in live streams without written approval by the Contracting Officer.

## **NOXIOUS WEEDS/EQUIPMENT CLEANING**

Noxious weeds are any exotic plant species established or that may be introduced into the State which may render land unfit for agriculture, forestry, livestock, wildlife, or other beneficial uses and which is designated by the State's Department of Agriculture, or by the County's weed management district, or by other appropriate agencies having jurisdiction. A weed management district is any area of land identified for the purpose of weed management or control. Such an identified land area may be, but is not limited to one of the following: a project or job site, a County, two or more Counties, or a National Forest.

To mitigate the anticipated impacts of spreading noxious species, the following precautions shall be used:

- All equipment and vehicles to be used at the job site shall be cleaned and free of noxious weeds and their seeds prior to entrance onto the project site. The restriction shall include equipment and vehicles intended for off-road as well as on-road use, whether they owned, leased, or borrowed by the contractor or any subcontractor.
- Cleaning shall consist of the removal all dirt, grease, debris, and materials that may harbor noxious weeds and their seeds. Cleaning shall occur off the project site.
- Equipment, materials, and vehicles shall be visually inspected by the COR, or other designated Forest Service official, and certified in writing by the Contractor to be reasonably clean and weed free. Inspections will take place at a location agreed to by the COR and Contractor in advance of delivery to the job site. Equipment and vehicles shall proceed directly to the job site following the inspection. Materials, including delivery vehicles, delivered to the project site will also be inspected prior to entering the area.
- The Contractor shall protect all existing vegetation from the introduction of noxious weeds, (1) at or near the work site, and (2) on adjacent property. The Contractor shall treat any introduced noxious weeds resulting from failure to exercise reasonable care in performing the work. If the Contractor fails or refuses to treat such weeds, the Contracting Officer may have the necessary work performed and charge the cost to the Contractor.
- Certification of each piece of equipment or vehicles shall remain valid for the duration of the project as long as the identified subjects remain solely on the project. Off road equipment that leaves the job site shall be recertified before being allowed to return. Individual worker's vehicles shall be parked at a staging area that will be designated by the COR.

Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor, wherever employed, and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility. HOLIDAYS: A minimum of ten paid holidays per year, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr's Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. (A contractor may substitute for any of the named holidays another day off with pay in accordance with a plan communicated to the employees involved.) (See 29 CFR 4174)

\*\* UNIFORM ALLOWANCE \*\*

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

Under the policy and guidance contained in All Agency Memorandum No. 159, the Wage and Hour Division does not recognize, for section 4(c) purposes, prospective wage rates and fringe benefit provisions that are effective only upon such contingencies as "approval of Wage and Hour, issuance of a wage determination, incorporation of the wage determination in the contract, adjusting the contract price, etc." (The relevant CBA section) in the collective bargaining agreement between (the parties) contains contingency language that Wage and Hour does not recognize as reflecting "arm's length negotiation" under section 4(c) of the Act and 29 C.F.R. 5.11(a) of the regulations. This wage determination therefore reflects the actual CBA wage rates and fringe benefits paid under the predecessor contract.

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the

work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination. Such conformed classes of employees shall be paid the monetary wages and furnished the fringe benefits as are determined. Such conforming process shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees. The conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits shall be retroactive to the commencement date of the contract. {See Section 4.6 (C)(vi)} When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF 1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order proposed classification title(s), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s), job description(s), and rationale for proposed wage rate(s), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. (See section 4.6(b)(2) of Regulations 29 CFR Part 4).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour decision to the contractor.
- 6) The contractor informs the affected employees.

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF 1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.




