Wildfire Update: Papoose Fire

Date of Detection: July 8, 2013. **Cause:** Lightning. **Size:** 9,508 acres.

Location: Papoose Creek, North-Fork Ranger District, about 40 air miles west of Salmon, ID

Managing Agency: U.S. Forest Service, Salmon-Challis National Forest

Activity on the Papoose Fire on Monday was minimal, with fire activity in the area of Big Hill creeping through grass, brush, and small stands of timber. The fire is burning in steep, rocky, inaccessible terrain above the Middle Fork of the Salmon River. Isolated thunderstorms swept across the Salmon-Challis National Forest Monday. A red flag warning will continue into tomorrow for thunderstorms and gusty winds. Firefighters from Colorado's White River Fire Module are patrolling the river corridor by boat. Fire managers are also developing strategies to protect structures from the mouth of the Middle Fork of the Salmon River to Arctic Creek Lodge on the Salmon River, in the event the fire reaches them. Previous trail closures were incorporated into the area closure; the Waterfall Trail and South Fork Waterfall Trail also remain closed. There were two new fires detected on the Salmon-Challis National Forest today. The fires are the three (3) acre Bear Fire and two (2) acre Dry Fire, which are staffed with six (6) fire personnel and a helicopter.

The 17,150-acre Gold Pan Fire on the Bitterroot N.F. is burning about 40 miles northwest of the town of North Fork. The 22,533-acre Lodgepole Fire is burning about eight miles west of Challis. The Elk Complex on the Boise N.F. has burned 90,249-acres about 24 miles northeast of Mountain Home. The 119,543-acre Pony Complex is burning on the Boise N.F. about 12 miles northeast of Mountain Home. Smoke from the fires on the Boise N.F. is drifting north toward Salmon and Challis.
