

# Free Personal Use Firewood Area – Brush Creek Visitor Center Brush Creek/Hayden Ranger District, Medicine Bow-Routt National Forests 2013 Firewood Collection

## Brush Creek Visitor Center Employee Parking/Housing Loop (approximately 20 cords)


From Highway 130 west of Ryan Park, turn into the Brush Creek Visitor Center. Drive straight east past the log visitor center building, then turn immediately right toward the south. Continue south past the end of pavement. Firewood may be collected from the areas on either side of the gravel loop road, but vehicles must remain on the roadway.

Trees have been planted to contribute to work toward reforesting this area, so use caution to avoid trees and plastic tree shelters while gathering wood.

For wood gathering areas at Brush Creek Visitor Center, the permit will also require that firewood gatherers abide by these special provisions:

- Keep vehicles on roads to protect newly planted trees and tree shelters,
- Respect the rights of campers and employees by not blocking employee access roads or parking areas,
- Gather wood only between 9 am to 6 pm to adhere with “quiet hours” and do not gather wood within occupied camp sites/RV sites.

# Free Personal Use Firewood Area – Deep Creek Campground Brush Creek/Hayden Ranger District, Medicine Bow-Routt National Forests 2013 Firewood Collection

## Deep Creek Campground (approximately 60 cords)

From Interstate 80 you can either take the exit for Arlington or Elk Mountain. From the Arlington exit take National Forest Service Road (NFSR) 111 south approximately 9 miles to the NFSR 101 and then continue south for another 1 1/4 miles to the Deep Creek Campground. From the Elk Mountain exit head south on County Road 72/NFSR 101 approximately 12 1/2 miles to Deep Creek Campground.

From Highway 130 take the NFSR 101 north for approximately 20 miles to the campground.
