FOREST SUPERVISOR'S ORDER

Pursuant to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.50 (a) and 261.50(b), the following act is prohibited as described below within the Missoula Ranger District of the Lolo National Forest. These restrictions are in addition to those enumerated in Subpart A, Part 261, Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, and become effective August 31, 2013 and will remain in effect until rescinded.

This order rescinds Forest Supervisor Order No. F13-054-LOLO-D3, signed on August 31, 2013.

36 CFR – Special Closures

It is prohibited to go into the area. (36 CFR 261.53(e)).

The closure cited in this order is to protect the public from potential harm from wildfires and firefighting operations associated with the Harry's Flat fire.

Description of Closed Areas:

Harry's Flat Campground located in T. 9 N., R. 17 W., Sec. 16.

Designated Dispersed Campsite #4 located in T. 9 N., R. 17 W., Sec. 20.

Designated Dispersed Campsite #5 located in T. 9 N., R. 17 W., Sec. 20.

36 CFR – National Forest System Trails

It is prohibited to be on the trails. (36 CFR 261.55(a)).

The closure cited in this order is to protect the public from potential harm from wildfires and firefighting operations associated with the Harry's Flat fire.

Description of Closed Trails:

Cinnamon Bear Trail #93 shall be closed in its entirety from the trail #93 trailhead and Rock Creek Road National Forest System Road (NFSR) #102 junction, starting in T. 9 N., R. 17 W., Sec. 14, to the trail #93 and NFSR #2129 junction ending in T. 9 N., R. 18 W., Sec. 3.

Cinnamon Bear Point Trail #346 shall be closed in its entirety from the trail #93 and trail #346 junction, starting in T. 9 N., R. 17 W., PB 42, to the trail #346 terminus at Cinnamon Bear Point ending in T. 9 N., R. 17 W., Sec. 5.

Exemptions:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit issued by a forest officer specifically authorizing the prohibited act.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
