



Middle Cottonwood Trail, No. 33086

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District

General Description: This trail follows the drainage and has views of the high alpine trees and meadows.

Trail Use: Foot, horse, and bicycle

Length: 1.1 miles one way

Trailhead Information: Accessed by a dirt road, no restroom available at the trailhead

Elevation in Feet: Min: 8,500 Max: 9,030 Change: 530




Water Availability: Water is available at the stream along the trail, but must be treated or filtered. It is located in the Cottonwood Creek near the trailhead and throughout the Cottonwood drainage.

Hazards /Obstacles: Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms.

Topographic Maps: USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle(s): Adams Head

The Trailhead: From the junction of Johns Valley Road (County Road 1660) and Mt. Dutton Road (No. 125), go west on the Mt. Dutton Road for approximately 9 miles to the trailhead. The trailhead is on the south side of the road.

The Trail: This trail follows the drainage and provides access to the Rock Creek Trail. A site has been leveled for a trailhead at the beginning of the trail and adjacent to the Mt. Dutton Road, and can be used for parking.
