







Cottonwood Creek Trail, No. 33087

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District

- General Description:** This trail begins on the Mt. Dutton Road (No. 125) and extends northerly to the North Fork of Cottonwood Trail.
- Trail Use:** Foot, horse, and bicycle
- Length:** 2.3 miles one way
- Trailhead Information:** Accessed by a dirt road, no restroom available at the trailhead
- Elevation in Feet:** Min: 9,140 Max: 9,460 Change: 320
- Water Availability:** No water available at the trailhead or along the trail.
- Hazards /Obstacles:** Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms.
- Topographic Maps:** USGS 7.5 minute quadrangle(s): Adams Head
Latitude 37°56.385, Longitude: W 112°11.464 for the connection off Mount Dutton road. (No.125)

The Trailhead: From the junction of the Johns Valley road (County Road 1660) and the Mount Dutton Road (No. 125), travel west on Mount Dutton road for approximately 10 miles to the trailhead located on the north side of the road.

The Trail: This trail skirts the hillside going through open sagebrush/rocky terrain and stands of mixed conifer. The trail offers access to the North Fork Cottonwood Trail.
