2. Memorandum of understanding (MOU): The version of the MOU that was mailed to KISMA partners for signatures is available at KISMA.ORG Ian Shackelford said that all but one of the partners (MSU Extension) had signed and returned the MOU. Once the remaining signature is obtained, the USFS Supervisor will sign the MOU and signed copies will be mailed out to all partners. Thank you, Ian, for all that you've done to make this happen! It was suggested that a press release be submitted when the MOU is finalized.

3. KISMA: September 2012 to present: There have been three KISMA steering committee meetings held in Houghton since September 2012 (16 January, 13 March, and 8 May 2013). Notes for these meetings are or will be available on KISMA.ORG Here are some things accomplished or in the works since September of last year:

- KISMA logo completed
- KISMA display board (Ian/ONF generously furnished blank display board and carrying case); the display board and accompanying brochures/booklets are available to KISMA partners for use at various events. Near the end of these notes (p. 9) is a sign-up list of partners who were interested in borrowing the display board and also the aquatic invasive species banner (Protect our Resources, Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers). Photos of these two items are in KISMA 8May2013 meeting notes. Please contact Janet if you would like to borrow either of these items. Also available in the 8May2013 meeting notes is a list of 2013 special events and festivals for Houghton and Keweenaw Cos. It was suggested that a similar list for Baraga County could be obtained from Tracey Barrett. This list is at the end of these meeting notes (pp. 10-12).

- KISMA now has an agreement with Waste Management so that we can bring invasive plants in green plastic bags marked INVASIVE PLANTS to the Houghton Waste Management (WM) Transfer Station for transfer to the Greenland landfill. In the past WM did not accept invasive plants. Pat Toczydlowski said that she could laminate permission letters to give to interested KISMA partners to show to WM's Transfer Station personnel when disposing of labeled green bags (bags available from Janet). Note: Permission from WM to dispose of bags only applies to bags brought to the WM Transfer Station and not the Houghton Co. Transfer Station in Atlantic Mine.
- Three grant proposals written (one not funded, one funded, one funding unknown):
 - Not funded: KBIC 2% fund proposal: to map Eurasian water milfoil (EWM) in Pike Bay (Keweenaw Waterway the following year, if funding). Nancy Leonard provided an update about Pike Bay's EWM issue showing us the first issue of the "Pike Bay Scoop" newsletter that discusses EWM in Pike Bay. Later this summer Chassell Twp will fund a survey including management recommendations.
 - Funded: \$1000 grant for tools from American Transmission Co: available for loan to KISMA partners: lopper, pruner, another slightly smaller weed wrench, handtools (asparagus weeders) for knapweed/garlic mustard pulls, boot brushes (volunteer gifts). KISMA partners may contact Janet to borrow any of these items.
 - Funding unknown: decision on funding will be made by August 1, 2013: MI DEQ water quality grant proposal to survey 40 highest priority Baraga, Houghton, & Keweenaw County lakes for EWM and seven other aquatic invasive species (AIS)
- Three Daily Mining Gazette publications: National Invasive Species Awareness Week, aquatic invasive species (AIS), more general article about invasives
- May: planted 500 red pine trees at McLain State Park at knapweed site (idea is to shade out knapweed in the future; may be additional plantings of trees and dune grass)
- May: garlic mustard (GM) flyers posted and GM pulling sessions by Jill VanderMeer at 11 GM sites (with guidance by Janet Marr and help from volunteers). Pulling Together funding to contract Jill obtained by Darcy Rutkowski (UP RC & D Council).
- Garlic mustard update: At least six new GM locations reported this spring; total known GM sites in Baraga, Houghton, and Keweenaw Counties now ~33 ; GM not coming back in some spots, some with a lot less GM now, and others need a lot of work (all locations need monitoring for at least 10 years because of seed viability)

5. KISMA all-partner meeting, 24 Sept 2013, Houghton: The schedule for the next all-partner meeting (24 September) was discussed.

- 10-12 a.m. meeting, Houghton Lakeshore Center conference room
- 12-1 p.m. lunch
- 1-2 p.m. Japanese/giant knotweed presentation (Janet) and possibly Pam Roberts (coordinator of Northwoods CWMA, Bayfield WI)
- 2-3 p.m. Discussion and demonstration of knotweed control at MTU parking lot (Ian)

6. KISMA in the future: Members of the steering committee were recognized and thanked. An invitation was made to anyone interested in becoming a member. Adrienne Bozic was added to the steering committee mailing list. A HKCD meeting was to be held on June 11 to discuss options for hiring a new coordinator once Janet's contract is up on 30 September 2013.

7. Comments and ideas: Ian discussed how beetles can be used in biological control of purple loosestrife and will be working with KBIC to provide beetles. Suggestions as to how to best submit an article to the L'Anse Sentinel were made. Much discussion followed after Dave Tormohlen mentioned that in Ontonagon County Plum Creek has used aerial spraying from helicopters to keep glossy buckthorn at bay in plantations. Ian brought a sample of the large sign below and said to contact him if you are interested in getting any of these signs.

HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF INVASIVE SPECIES

Before launching and before leaving.

- ✓ **INSPECT** boats, trailers, and equipment.
- ✓ **REMOVE** all aquatic plants, animals, and mud.
- ✓ **DRAIN** water from boat, motor, live well, and equipment.
- ✓ **NEVER MOVE** plants or live animals from one water-body to another.
- ✓ **DO NOT** release worms or unused bait.

Look Out for these Harmful Species

The mat-forming **Eurasian water-milfoil** spreads by fragments that can be transported on boats and trailers. Look for leaves with 12 or more leaflet pairs.

Rusty crayfish destroy weed beds, fish habitat, and native crayfish populations. Look for dark, rust-colored patches on the shell.

Curly-leaf pondweed forms dense mats in the spring. Look for stiff, crinkled leaves with small 'teeth' around their edges.

Small zebra and quagga mussels are filter feeders, consuming plankton that young fish need. Surfaces such as boats and docks may be covered by their sharp shells.

The fish disease **viral hemorrhagic septicemia (VHS)** kills muskies, walleye, whitefish, yellow perch, and others. Disinfect the hull and live wells of boats used on the Great Lakes with a solution of 1/3 cup chlorine bleach per 5 gallons of water.

Spiny and fishhook waterfleas are tiny (< 1/2 inch) crustaceans that compete with small fish for food and collect in masses, fouling fishing lines and equipment.

Inspect everything!
It is illegal to launch with aquatic plants attached to boat or trailer (MI Public Act 91 of 2009).

8. Presentation: Sand Point Restoration Site: Pam Nankervis gave an informative half-hour powerpoint presentation about the Sand Point Restoration site located just north of Baraga on Lake Superior's Keweenaw Bay. Historically the Sand Point area was used by native people for hundreds of years and continues to be culturally very important. In 2006, KBIC began remediation of the area where stamp sands produced from a nearby stamp mill had been deposited early in the 20th century. A soil cap and mounds were installed and a diversity of native species has been planted many of which were grown at KBIC's Natural Resource Department's greenhouse.

1:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.: Tour of Sand Point Restoration Site

KBIC Natural Resources staff (Evelyn Ravindran, Pam Nankervis, and Karen Andersen) led a tour of about a dozen KISMA partners and friends around the Sand Point restoration site including the 1-acre demonstration garden at the trail head. We were able to see firsthand all of the restoration efforts that have been made to date: addition of the soil cap, topographical relief, and native vegetation (trees, shrubs, and herbaceous plants) to the site. These changes will increase habitat for birds and wildlife and provide educational and recreational opportunities to residents and visitors alike.

1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.: Nine folks planted two native plant species (boneset and big bluestem) at the Sand Point restoration site. Boneset was planted along the shore of the restoration site's pond as it likes to keep its feet (roots) wet and big bluestem was planted on nearby drier soil mounds. These are two of the many native species that have been planted at the restoration site and the demonstration garden.
