



Losee Canyon Trail, No. 33090

Dixie National Forest, Powell Ranger District



- General Description:** This trail travels along a wash bed surrounded by red rock formations and a mixed conifer forest.
- Trail Use:** Foot, horse, and bicycle
- Length:** 2.9 miles/4.7 kilometers one way
- Trailhead Information:** Accessed by a graded gravel road; the trailhead has a parking area, vault restroom, hitching rails, and loading ramp for horses
- Elevation in Feet:** Min: 7,100 Max: 7,670 Elevation change: 550 feet/167 meters
- Water Availability:** No water is available at the trailhead or along the trail. Potable water is available at the Red Canyon Visitor Center.
- Hazards /Obstacles:** Weather can change quickly. Be prepared for inclement weather year round. Flash floods are possible in stream bottoms.
- Topographic Maps:** USGS 7.5 minute quadrangles: Casto Canyon
Latitude: N 37°44.163, Longitude: W 112°20.028

The Trailhead: Drive approximately 2 miles east on Utah Highway 12 from US Highway 89 to just past the brown sign for Losee and Casto Canyons. Turn on this road, BLM #1700. Drive this road 3 miles to the Casto Canyon Trailhead. Caution: This road can become inaccessible at any time during or after a rain storm.

The Trail: The trail goes from the bottom of a wash highlighted with red rock cliffs bordering both sides of the trail, to the top of Red Canyon on the Cassidy trail. This trail has many breathtaking views of rocks, cliffs, vegetation, and wildlife.

When you reach the Cassidy Trail (No. 33093), you can go north to Casto Canyon or south to Red Canyon. This single track trail is well marked with some trail blazes on trees, some trail signs and directional signs at trail junctions.

Loop Opportunity: Casto Canyon Trail (motorized and non-motorized, No. 33089), Cassidy Trail (No. 33093), Losee Canyon Trail, and Casto Canyon Road (No. 927). 12 miles/19 kilometers. Foot, horse, and bicycle.
